Members will then have 1 week to reply by completing the on-line survey.

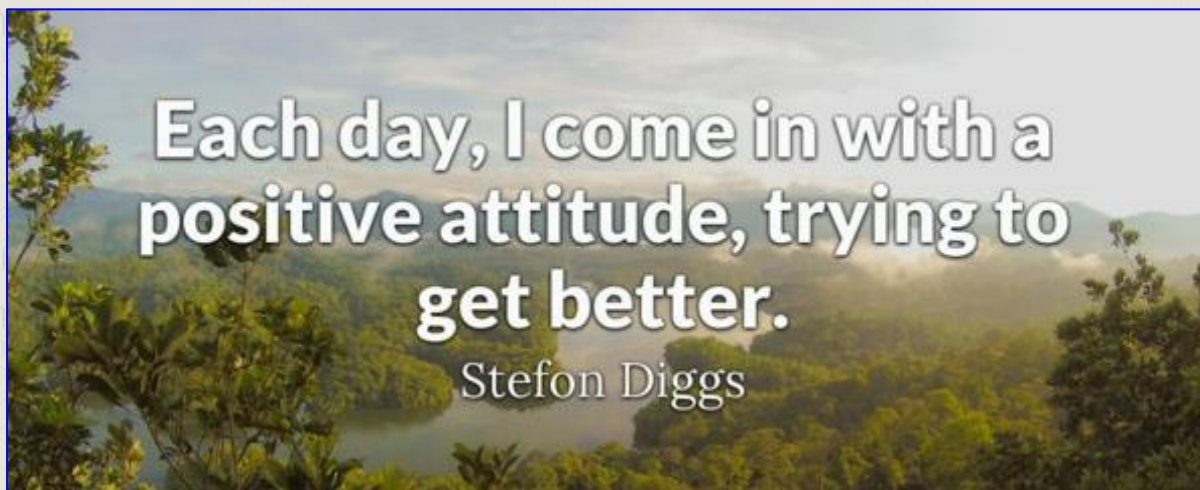
We have then allowed 1 week to collate the data and try and work out which areas most members have issues with, and which areas we are doing well in.

Don't feel like a walk just join us for coffee but let me know so I can forewarn Sunil at the café.



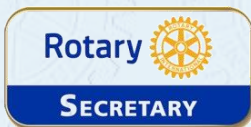

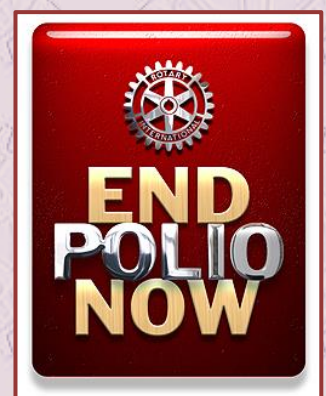

Polio This Week 10th July 2018

- A Disease Outbreak News (DON) notification was issued on 10 July on the Democratic Republic of the Congo’s three concurrent circulating vaccine-derived poliovirus type 2 (cVDPV2) outbreaks.
- Papua New Guinea prepares for the launch of large-scale immunization campaigns in Morobe, Madang and Eastern Highlands provinces, set to commence next week.
- Summary of new cases this week: Last week’s advance notifications of one wild poliovirus type 1 (WPV1) case in Afghanistan and one cVDPV2 case in Somalia with a cVDPV2 positive community contact have been confirmed. Two new WPV1 positive environmental samples have been reported in Afghanistan, and four new WPV1 positive environmental samples have been reported in Pakistan. - A new GPEI ‘[Coffee With Polio Experts](#)’ video interview featuring World Health Organization’s Honorine Mollard Billard looks at the importance of country support to vaccination campaigns, why polio-free countries need to maintain high immunity levels, and additional health interventions offered to communities during polio campaigns.





Guest Speaker: Pam Orman: Older People's Rights Services



Older People's Right Service is funded by Department of Local Government and Communities. It is a service to protect elderly people from forms of abuse. Many seniors prefer to remain in their own homes for as long as possible and recent reforms in aged care now give more choice to consumers choosing that option.

Since February 2017, all government funded home care packages have been provided to individual consumers rather than allocated to approved providers. So this new model of consumer directed care allows older consumers more flexibility and choice in their care arrangements.

With more choice now available, if you are assigned a home care package it's important to compare providers and find the care that's best for you. So do your research, ask questions, and read testimonials and reviews before entering into any home care agreement.

When you buy goods or services you have rights under the Australian Consumer Law. The same rights apply when buying home care goods and services or receiving them under a government funded home care package. These rights are in addition to the rights and responsibilities that you have under the Aged Care laws.

The shocking tales of elder abuse victims

It's been branded a silent epidemic in our suburbs. Now the stories of the elderly victims of abuse at the hands of their own family can be told.

They range from grandmothers with terminal cancer to women who have spent their lives in abusive domestic relationships, to fiercely independent octogenarians and cruise-loving seniors who cannot get their boomerang kids to leave home.

These are just some of the stories of elder abuse victims shared with a West Australian parliamentary inquiry, and they show the problem is affecting seniors from all walks of life. The case studies have been submitted to the inquiry — which resumes public hearings next month — by lawyers Fran Ottolini and Vicki Edwards, who help victims at their Northern Suburbs Community Legal Centre (NSCLC) in Perth.

One tells of an 80-year-old woman who, while planning what to wear to her granddaughter's wedding, unknowingly signed papers which handed over ownership of her house to her granddaughter.

Another explains how a frail elderly woman thought she had finally found peace from her life of domestic violence, but was forced to move into a nursing home after her son used her money to buy himself a house.

The lawyers say most of their clients are women aged over 60, who become at greater risk of abuse at times of grief or bad health and need to depend more heavily on their trusted friends and family. Most of the perpetrators are daughters, which they say runs counter to the trend in Australia of predominantly male perpetrators.

Some of them are known as boomerang kids — adult children who return to live with their parents, often after a relationship breakdown, mental health problem or losing their job.

While these arrangements can work for some families, if they do not, it can be very difficult for a parent to get their child to move out.

Elder abuse was different to family and domestic violence because it involved an abuse of trust.

Elder abuse is a complex interpersonal, health and social problem where there is a power imbalance (whether usurped or granted) and a breach of trust involving older people

Board of Directors Meetings

The 2017–18 RI Board of directors held its fifth and final meeting on 21 June 2018 in Toronto, Canada.

The 2018–19 RI Board held its first meeting on 29 June 2018 in Toronto, Canada. At these meetings the Board reviewed reports from six committees and recorded 39 decisions.

June 2018 Board Meeting: (excerpts President Stephen wished to include here)

Looked favorably on the general secretary’s decision to recognize the LGBT Rotarians and Friends Fellowship and the Young Rotarians’ Fellowship, and further amended the definition of a Rotary Fellowship to be:

A Rotary fellowship is a group of Rotarians, their family members, Rotaractors, program participants, and alumni who globally unite around a common interest, vocation, or recreational activity with the primary purpose to network and further friendship.”

□ Adopted a new strategic plan for Rotary with four key priorities:

- Eradicate polio and leverage the legacy
- Focus our programs and offerings
- Improve our ability to achieve and measure impact

Enhance participant engagement

- Support clubs to better engage their Members
