Last week's DG visit must have made quite an impression, judging by the number of photos that appeared in the latest issue of *Rotary Out West*.

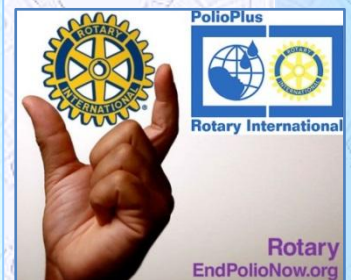

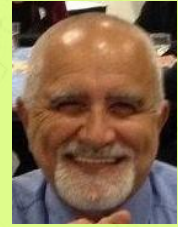
