New member application fee will be \$100 (to cover member paraphernalia)

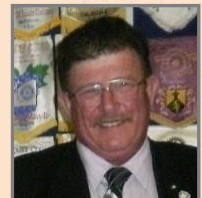
Dues are trickling in, won't call in the 'Heavies' as yet.

City of Kwinana and Kwinana Rotary Club are working together to design and build a new universally inclusive playground at Calista Oval.

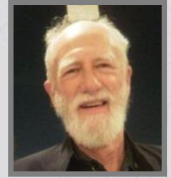

Matt W spotted at the Chiropractor being instructed on how to’ tighten his butt’ we don’t need to delve any further into that one.

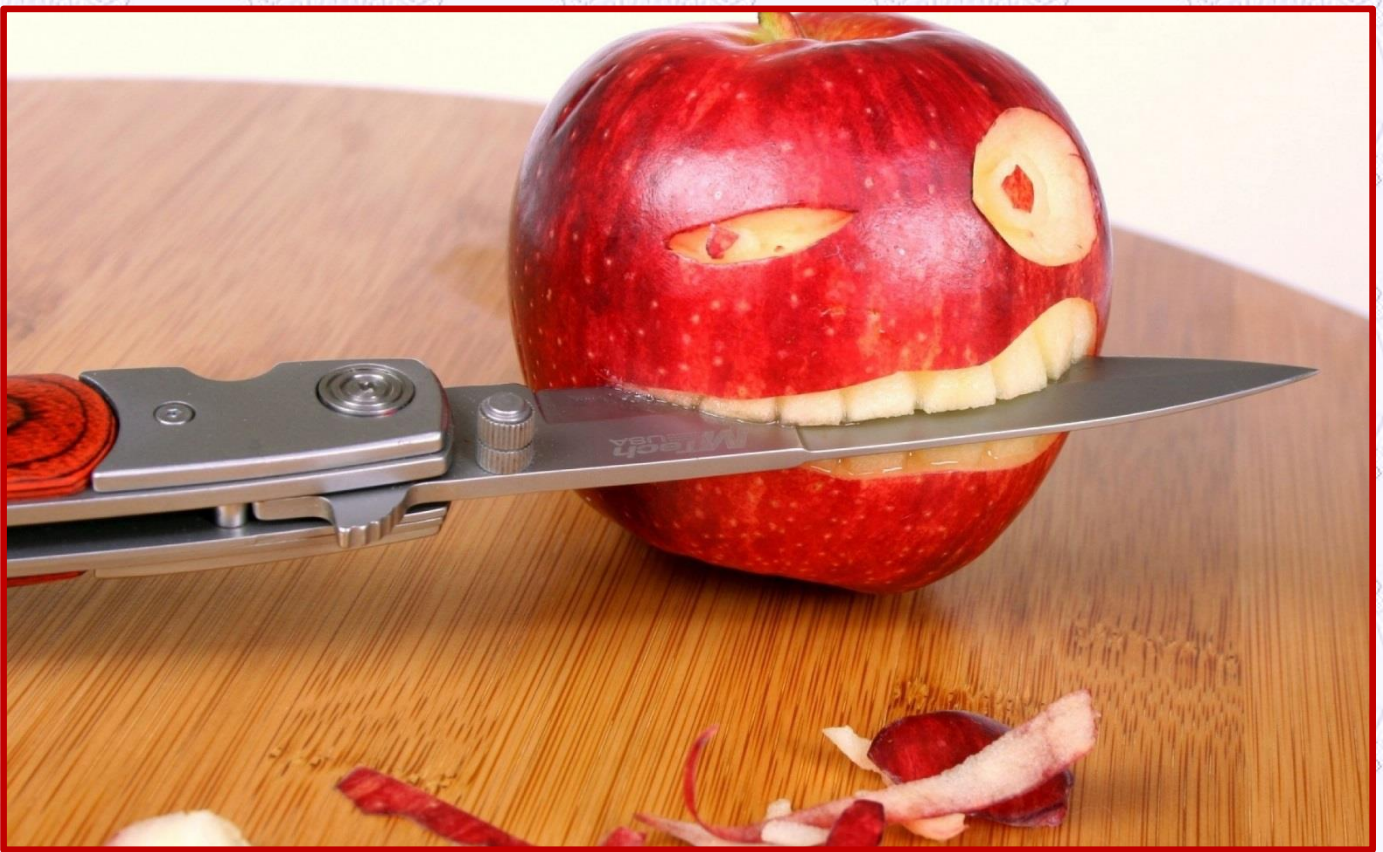
