2023 Rotary International Convention in Melbourne May 27-31 2023



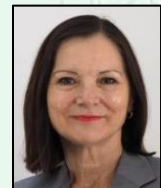

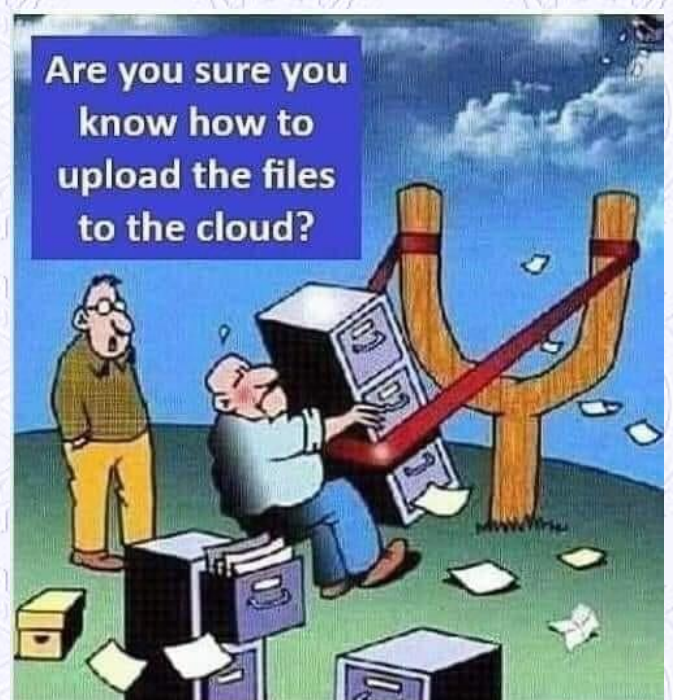
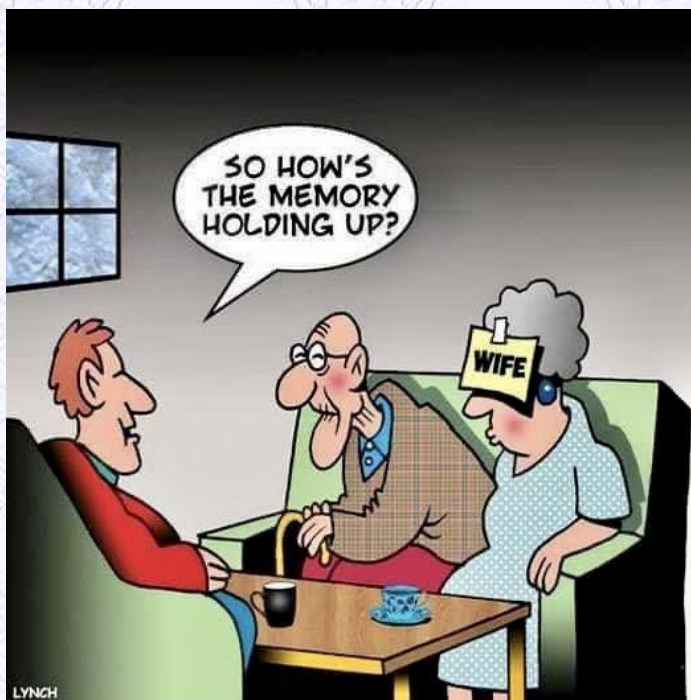

Polio this week

28th July 2021

The United Arab Emirates (UAE) on July 24 announced an additional US\$9.5 million support to the Pakistan Polio Eradication Initiative (PEI). The funding will be used to vaccinate approximately 16 million children during door-to-door immunization campaigns in 84 highest-risk districts as well as an additional US\$376,000 to provide personal protective equipment against COVID-19 for the frontline campaign workers. Senegal: one cVDPV2 case

Uganda : two cVDPV2 positive environmental samples
