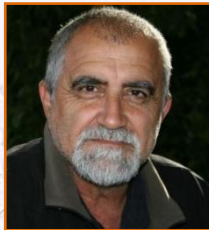

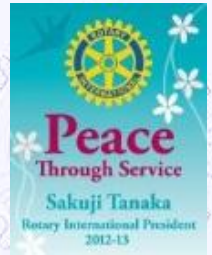

- **District grants**
Block grants that help clubs and districts address immediate needs in their communities and abroad
- **Global grants**
Range from \$15,000 to \$200,000 and offer opportunities to participate in strategically focused, high-impact activities within the [six areas of focus](#)
- **Packaged grants**
Enable clubs and districts to work with Rotary's strategic partners on predesigned projects and activities

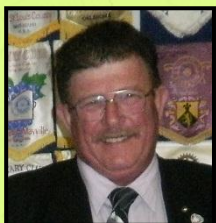

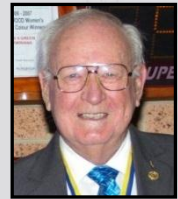

My role as AG.

Introduction by PE James Sharkey

This is my second year as Assistant Governor and happy to be on the leadership Team with DG Bob Cooper during the Rotary year of World President Sakuji Tanaka under the great theme, "Peace Through Service". My role as Assistant Governor is spelt out in one of RI produced training and information publications, Assistant Governor's Training Manual. It says that the AG has responsibility both to the DG and to their allocated Clubs in;

- Assisting the development of District goals;
- Coordinating the DG official visit with Clubs;
- Communicating Club strengths and weaknesses to DG
- Attending District meetings;
- Participation in Rotary Foundation programs, events and fundraising;
- Helping develop future District leaders; and
- Briefing the incoming AG on status of Clubs.

The AG Guidebook tells me that I should visit my allocated Clubs regularly (they say monthly) however, I have programmed my visits in for the alternative suggestion of "at least" quarterly The Clubs in my group are;

.It is wonderful to see our Club plus the four Clubs in my Group working and achieving on a wide array of projects that fall within the RI "Six areas of focus"

- Peace and Conflict Resolution
- Disease Prevention and treatment
- Water and sanitation
- Maternal and Child health
- Basic education and literacy
- Economic and community development

A common denominator I notice as I travel around the Clubs is the support for RI and the End Polio campaign and the giving of it the financial support priority it warrants. It is critical to Polio eradication success that we continue our efforts and financial support.

A shared concern of all Clubs is the push for membership recruitment and member retention. Membership Director Brian McCallum and I will shortly be conducting a workshop on options that the Club could adopt for the attraction of new members and specifically how we can make the best use of the recently received Rotary in WA promotion material.

A copy of the material will now be distributed to each of you so that you can read it, think about it, and formulate some options for tossing into the workshop pot for the soon to scheduled workshop meeting.

Let's all get behind Membership Director Brian on this one.
