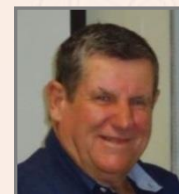

### This Week in History

August 12<sup>th</sup> 1829 The City of Perth, Western Australia is founded



The first official landing of a European on the northwestern coast of Australia occurred when Dutch captain Dirk Hartog landed near Cape Inscription in 1616. Although further Dutch sightings of Australia followed as the route became more popular and the land became known as "New Holland", the Dutch saw no value in the dry and barren country.

Although the northwest was forbidding and inhospitable, the southwestern corner held more promise. Dutch sea-captain Willem de Vlamingh named the Swan River in 1697 because of the black swans he saw in abundance there while exploring the area. The name remained for the early years of British settlement.

The city of Perth, capital of Western Australia, grew up around the Swan River, and was therefore originally known as the Swan River Colony. The city itself started out as a free colony in 1829 with the arrival of around 100 pioneer men, women and children. The Swan River colony was proclaimed in June 1829.

The settlement of the Colony was founded with the ceremonial cutting down of a Sheoak tree, by Mrs. Helen Dance, on a site close to the present Town Hall, on 12 August 1829.

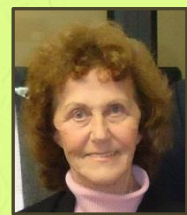

Sam C: Fined for 'not' going back for 'seconds' tonight.

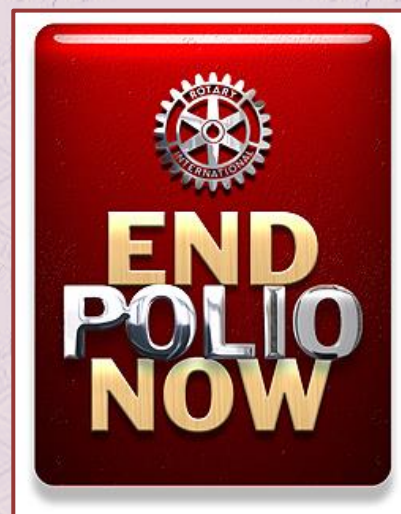
James S: Heard to comment 'Hooray' when Max informed that it would be a short meeting tonight.

Polio this week 5<sup>th</sup> August 2015

- This week the emergency committee of the International Health Regulations (IHR) is meeting for the sixth time to assess whether the international spread of polio continues to constitute a Public Health Emergency of International Concern (PHEIC).
- Despite the deteriorating security situation in Yemen, a humanitarian pause enabled 50,000 children to be reached with the oral polio vaccine during the final week of Ramadan

On 11 August, we will mark a tremendous milestone:

**One full year without a single case of polio caused by wild poliovirus in Africa.**

The magnitude of this achievement can hardly be overstated. A polio-free Africa has been within sight, so near and yet so far, for over a decade. The hard work and commitment that have brought us to this point have been nothing short of heroic. Tens of thousands of health workers reached hundreds of millions of children with vaccine, in some of the most difficult conditions imaginable. Together, we have done what once seemed impossible: We have stopped polio in Africa.

Yet this progress, momentous as it is, is still fragile. As long as polio exists in the two remaining endemic countries of Pakistan and Afghanistan, the virus still has the potential to spread and to spark new outbreaks.

Now, more than ever, we need the power of all of Rotary to carry us through to the end: not just a polio-free Africa, but a polio-free world.

Wherever you live, whether your country has just conquered polio or has been polio-free for decades, we need your voice, and your help. ## Fact Sheet | Rotary and ShelterBox



### Partnership background

The project partnership between Rotary and ShelterBox offers opportunities to collaborate in providing emergency shelter and vital supplies to stabilize, protect, and support communities affected by disasters and humanitarian crises.

### About ShelterBox

ShelterBox is an international relief charity that provides immediate assistance to people affected by disasters such as earthquakes, volcanic activity, flooding, hurricanes, cyclones, tsunamis, or conflict. With 17 international affiliates, ShelterBox provides shelter, lifesaving equipment, and educational materials to hard-hit communities worldwide.

Since its founding in 2000, ShelterBox has responded to more than 200 natural disasters and humanitarian crises in almost 90 countries, providing vital aid for well over 1 million people.

### How do ShelterBox response teams operate?

A highly trained ShelterBox response team, composed mainly of volunteers, distributes ShelterBoxes at the site of a disaster, working closely with local organizations, international aid agencies, and a global network of volunteers.

Each ShelterBox, tailored to the particular disaster, typically contains a relief tent for an extended family, blankets, water storage and purification equipment, cooking utensils, a stove, a basic tool kit, a children's activity pack, and other essential items.

Distributions may also include SchoolBoxes containing essential tools for teachers and basic educational supplies for 50 children.

### How can my Rotary club or district get involved?

Rotary clubs and districts can assist ShelterBox with emergency disaster relief efforts that meet the needs of an affected community.

Some collaboration examples include:

- Organizing and taking part in an event that raises funds for ShelterBox, or making a donation to ShelterBox
- Assisting with local deployment efforts by helping to clear aid through customs, accommodating response teams, or training members of local communities in setting up relief tents
- Aligning ShelterBox relief efforts with local governments and organizations working in areas devastated by disaster or humanitarian crisis

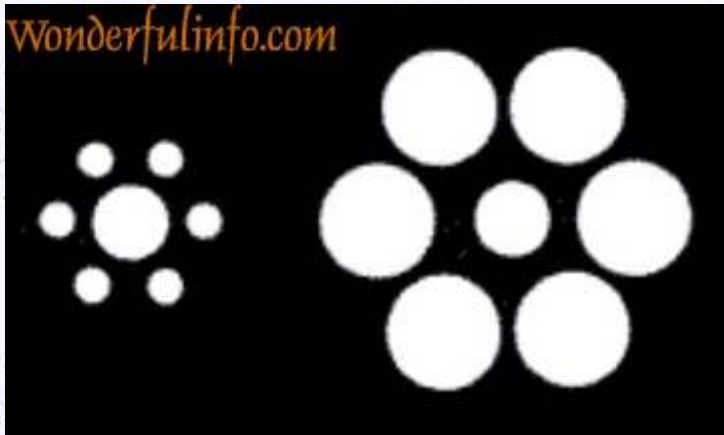
