## Standing Orders – Review

### SO 3: Club Service

#### 3.1 Club Organisation & Management

The club management structure and duties of Directors, Managers and Officers are detailed in Attachments;

- **2a: Club Organisation**, and
- **2b: Club Service Management**.

The club management structure and duties is to be reviewed annually with Standing Orders.

#### 3.2: Club Dress Code

The standard dress code for regular Club dinner meetings is “Smart Casual”. This standard may be relaxed at a meeting at the discretion of the President.

Changeover Night and the District Governor’s visit are considered to be formal occasions; as such, Club members and partners are expected to be appropriately dressed.

#### 3.3: Club Meeting Catering

The Club Service Director, in conjunction with the Attendance Officer, is responsible for communications with those responsible for Club catering needs.

#### 3.4: Club Nominations

When it is proposed that the club nominate or endorse a person for any award, recognition or position of office, the nomination must have the prior support of the Board before it is actioned.

Examples of such nominations include, a Paul Harris Fellow, RI Certificate of Appreciation, City of Kwinana Award nomination, or as a club representative on a community committee.

#### 3.5: Applications for Leave of Absence

The Board will consider and may approve at its discretion all applications for ‘Leave of Absence’ submitted by club members. The length of the Leave of Absence approval will be at the discretion of the Board.

The Board shall not grant any Leave of Absence application unless the member applying for it is a financial member of the Rotary Club of Kwinana and remains financial for the full duration of any approved Leave of Absence.

If any approved Leave of Absence enters the next Rotary year, then the member will be required to pre-pay the Club dues (as estimated) for that next Rotary year.

#### 3.6: Electrical Equipment Servicing

Under the direction of the Club Service Director, arrangements will be made with a qualified electrician to undertake the required quarterly, annual and maintenance servicing of electrical leads and equipment.

#### 3.7: Lease of Rotary Hall

The Hall is on lease from the City of Kwinana for a period of 10 years commencing August 2014.

A six monthly (November and May) safety inspection of the hall, sheds and grounds is to be conducted using the club’s safety inspection checklist.

Polio This Week 7<sup>th</sup> August 2018

In Papua New Guinea, a third case of circulating vaccine-derived poliovirus type 1 (cVDPV1) has been confirmed, from a newly-infected province (Enga province). Emergency outbreak response is being enhanced and reviewed, including to potentially expand vaccination geographically.

Summary of new viruses this week:  
Papua New Guinea – one new case of cVDPV1; and,  
Pakistan – four new wild poliovirus type 1-positive environmental samples.

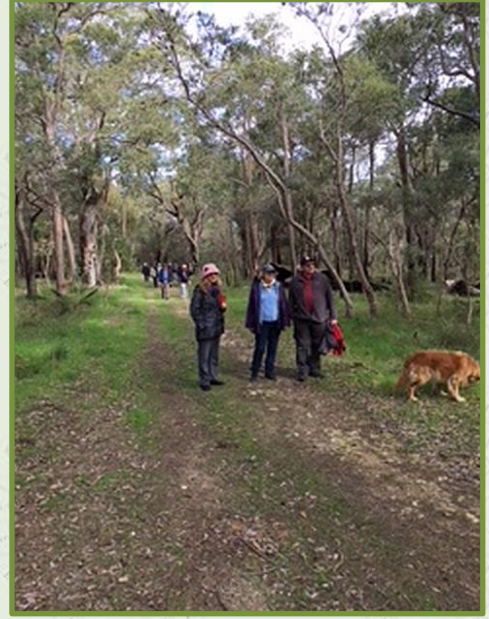

### Rotary International President Nominee 2020 – 21

Sushil Kumar Gupta, of the Rotary Club of Delhi Midwest, Delhi, India, is the selection of the Nominating Committee for President of Rotary International for 2020-21. He will be declared the president-nominee on 1 October if no challenging candidates have been suggested.

Gupta wants to increase Rotary's humanitarian impact as well as the diversity of its membership.

"As individuals, we can only do so much," Gupta said in a statement. "But when 1.2 million Rotarians work together, there is no limit to what we can achieve, and in the process, we can truly change the world."

Gupta has been a Rotarian since 1977 and has served Rotary as district governor, training leader, and resource group adviser, and as a member, vice chair, or chair of several committees.

Sushil Kumar Gupta, of the Rotary Club of Delhi Midwest, Delhi, India, is the selection of the Nominating Committee for President of Rotary International for 2020-21.

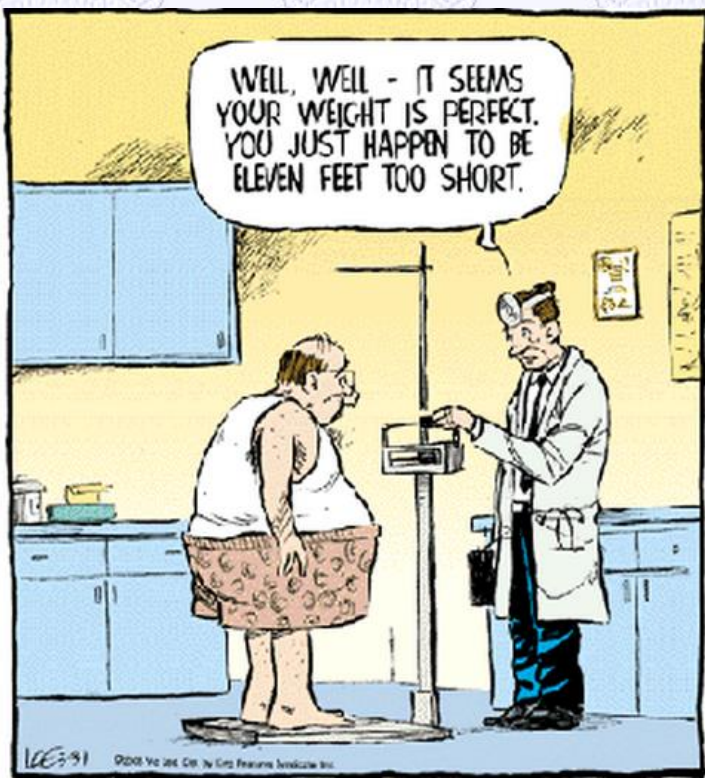
He was awarded an honorary Doctor of Science degree by the IIS University, Jaipur, in recognition of his contributions to water conservation.

He has also received the coveted Padma Shri Award, the fourth-highest civilian award in India, conferred by the president of India for distinguished service to tourism and social work.

Gupta has also received the Distinguished Service Award from The Rotary Foundation for his support of its humanitarian and educational programs. He and his wife, Vinita, are Major Donors to The Rotary Foundation and members of the Arch Klumph Society.

Gupta is chair and managing director of Asian Hotels (West) Ltd., and owner of Hyatt Regency Mumbai and JW Marriott Hotel New Delhi Aerocity. He has served as president of the Federation of Hotel and Restaurant Associations of India and on the board of directors of Tourism Finance Corporation of India Ltd. He is the president of Experience India Society, a public-private partnership between the tourism industry and the government of India that promotes India as a tourist destination. He is also vice chair of the Himalayan Environment Trust and serves on the board of Operation Eyesight Universal in India.
