Guest Speaker this week was Rio-Rita Lutui and Rose Roberts from NGARU POU a group dedicated to promote and nurture the Maori culture to children from 5 to 15 years, Rio also gave us a little taste of Maori music.

Rotary announced on August 15th that nearly US\$100 million in grants to support the global effort to end polio, a vaccine-preventable disease that once paralyzed hundreds of thousands of children each year. The announcement comes as Nigeria marks two years without any reported cases of wild poliovirus, following four reported cases in 2016.

To support polio eradication efforts in countries where polio remains endemic, Rotary is allocating the majority of the funds it announced today to Afghanistan (\$22.9 million), Pakistan (\$21.7 million), and Nigeria (\$16.1 million).

Rotary has committed to raising \$50 million a year to be matched 2-to-1 by the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation, yielding \$450m for polio eradication activities over a three-year period. To date, Rotary has contributed more than \$1.8 billion to fight the disease.

Standing Orders - Review

SO 4: Financial Management

4.1 Club Fund Accounts

Club Funds are maintained in one Bendigo Bank account but separated into two fund accounts.

Rotary Club of Kwinana Inc. Club Service and Charity Account

Club Service funds are raised from the members directly, and from activities such as the City of Kwinana Australia Day and Anzac Day functions Wellard Markets where club members perform a service and the club is paid accordingly.

Funds may also be raised from the public where they knowingly support the Club Service account, such as where the club charges for advertising or hire on the club vehicles and assets.

Club Service funds will generally be expended on club related expenses, but may be used for charitable purposes.

4.2 Additional Accounts

Additional accounts have been opened with the Bendigo Bank to facilitate operations in club projects;

- Rotary Club of Kwinana Inc. Show and Shine Account Rotary Club of Kwinana Inc. Show and Shine Account
- Rotary Club of Kwinana Inc. Wellard Kwinana Markets Account The Rotary Club of Kwinana Inc. Markets Account
- Rotary Club of Kwinana International Projects Accounts

The following three accounts were instituted to facilitate the operations of International Foundation Projects;

The Rotary Club of Kwinana Inc. International Foundation Project Account

The Rotary Club of Kwinana Inc. International Operating Account

The Rotary Club of Kwinana Surplus School Computers Account

Note: As these International funds are required to be kept separate from other club funds involving combined Rotary Clubs and other organisations funds and used only for International Projects the responsibility for the management and auditing of these International Funds shall be the International Services Manager.

Jakarta Account

This account was opened to facilitate and assist the Rotaract Club of Rockingham/ Kwinana with the operation of an International Project in Jakarta;

The Rotary Club of Kwinana Inc Jakarta Account

Interact Account

This additional account was opened to facilitate the operations of the Interact Projects.

The Rotary Club of Kwinana Inc. Interact Account

4.3 Charity Account

The Charity fund account contains funds raised for local, national and overseas community benefit. Charity funds are not available to subsidise Club Service funds. The Charity account may be subject to a 5% management fee, the fee to be transferred into the Club Service Fund.

Funds will be raised by the entire club membership working towards a common goal;

"ONE CLUB ONE GOAL".

All funds raised from the public including, but not limited to, Community BBQs and Markets, will be kept in an account for Charity funds. The cost of raising those funds will be deducted from the funds raised and the surplus used on local, national and international community projects.

4.4 Signatories

Signatories to accounts are club positions: - President, Secretary, Treasurer, Projects Director and International Service Manager. Signatories will be issued with the necessary internet token. Method of signing is Treasurer plus any other two to sign.

4.5 Applications for Financial Assistance by Individuals

Unless the Standing Orders provide for it, or the Board considers otherwise, the Club shall not financially support an individual's application to the Club for assistance.

4.6 Yearly Audit and Financial Reports

- **4.6.1** The financial year for accounting purposes shall be from July 01 to June 30 the next year.
- **4.6.2** An unaudited balance sheet and statement of income and expenses to the end of May of the current Rotary year will be produced by the Treasurer for inclusion in the Annual Report presented to members at the Club's Changeover Meeting.
- **4.6.3** The audited report shall be completed as soon as practicable after Changeover and by the end of October each year at the latest.
- **4.6.4** The Club must convene an Annual General Meeting (AGM) within 6 months of the end of the financial year to achieve compliance with the Associations' Incorporation Act (2015). The agenda for the AGM shall be:
 - 1. Consideration of the Club's financial accounts for the previous financial year.
 - Any other business requiring consideration of the Club of which at least seven days' notice in writing of the proposed business has been provided in writing to the Secretary for distribution to the club members prior to the AGM.
- **4.6.5** The Club is a Tier 1 association with a revenue of less than \$250,000 and so can elect to prepare basic financial statements with no independent review or audit. The Club has elected to adopt the Tier 2 standard applied to larger incorporated bodies and have the reports reviewed by a member of a professional accounting body.

Polio This Week 14th August 2018

Summary of new viruses this week:

Afghanistan – one new case of wild poliovirus type 1 (WPV1) and one new WPV1 positive environmental sample.

Pakistan – four new WPV1 positive environmental samples.

Nigeria – one new case of circulating vaccine-derived poliovirus type 2 (cVDPV2). Papua New Guinea – one new case of cVDPV1.

What Gender is a Computer?

Instead of giving the answer, the teacher split the class into two groups, male and female, and asked them to decide for themselves whether "computer" should be a masculine or a feminine noun.


Each group was asked to give four reasons for its recommendation.
