

Fuel Cost = \$26 (Avg fuel consumption is 15.7L/100Kms ~ 20L) 20L @ \$1.30/L = \$26

Guest Speaker




Bob Cooper

- He worked in the air-conditioner industry for a while, then gave it up to join the police force.
