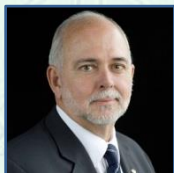
Looking forward to our next social function on Saturday 1st September, a visit to Catalano & Co restaurant in Baldivis.

Standing Orders – Review

SO 5: Projects

5.1 Project Management

- 5.1.1 Each club project shall have a Project Manager who shall prepare a project plan and budget to a standard acceptable by the Board. No club project is to be implemented prior to acceptance by the Board. New projects will be subject to the club risk identification and risk analysis process.
- 5.1.2 Club members will be allocated to a specific project to assist service and project managers. Service and project managers will report to the Board through the general guidance of the Projects Director. Each year the Projects Director will meet with the service and project managers to develop a Charity fund budget proposal. The budget proposal is to be considered by the Board for approval.
- 5.1.3 Should a worthy non-budgeted project arise during the year the relevant Service Manager, in conjunction with the Projects Director, shall provide a justification report to the Board for their consideration and recommendation.
- 5.1.4 Where on completion of a Board-approved project there are funds surplus to the project budget, these surplus funds shall become Charity funds and will be transferred to the Charity Funds account for reallocation by the Board in the current or in the following year's club budget.

Polio This Week 23rd August 2018

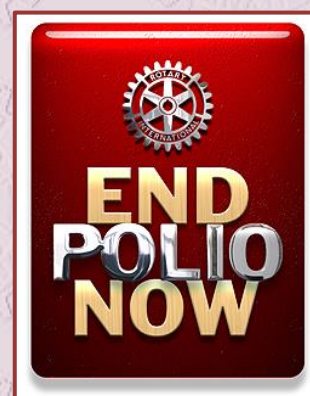
Summary of new viruses this week: Afghanistan

Two new wild poliovirus type 1 (WPV1)

Positive environmental samples. Democratic Republic of the Congo – circulating vaccine-derived poliovirus type 2 detected in the stool samples of two healthy contacts of two different negative AFP cases.

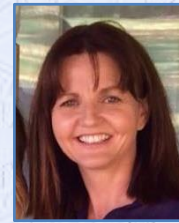
Nigeria – one new case of cVDPV2, and two new cVDPV2 positive environmental samples.

Somalia – one new case of cVDPV2.

Linda is very pleased and enthusiastic about the involvement and support The Rotary Club of Kwinana is providing to Gilmore College through the Breakfast Program and now the formation of an Interact Club on the campus.

Interact is Rotary International's service club for young people ages 12 to 18. Interact clubs are sponsored by individual Rotary clubs, which provide support and guidance, but they are self-governing and self-supporting.

Gilmore College Interact Club held its first meeting on 4th September 2017, since then GKIC has held weekly meetings on Wednesdays with students, staff and Rotary club members. So far the club has held two fundraising events and supports the school at awareness events. Our first fundraiser was selling drinks at the Arts Fest where the students had a great night. GKIC also supports the school at community events like Harmony Night, where the club held a face painting stall, promoting the club within the school and the wider community. The club held a cake stall at lunch time, raising over \$500. In August 2018 some funds from the cake stall went to supporting filling shoe boxes for Red Cross.

Money has been raised towards buying white boards and resources at the clubs sponsor school in Indonesia.

Each day our Breakfast Club is served by dedicated volunteers from Kwinana Rotary Club. Over 80 students are served breakfast every day. Bread is prepared and delivered by Kwinana Rotary and used to run the Breakfast Club for the student 'Lunch Slip Program' where students with no lunch are given a sandwich.

The Kwinana Rotary Club serve as huge support to the school community by volunteering at our school community events such as:

Harmony Day - Supporting the Interact Club.

R U OK Day: - Providing 500 students, sausages.

Sports Carnival - Supports the community with equipment and volunteers.

Supporting individual family and student needs within the school community with items such as furniture and laptops.

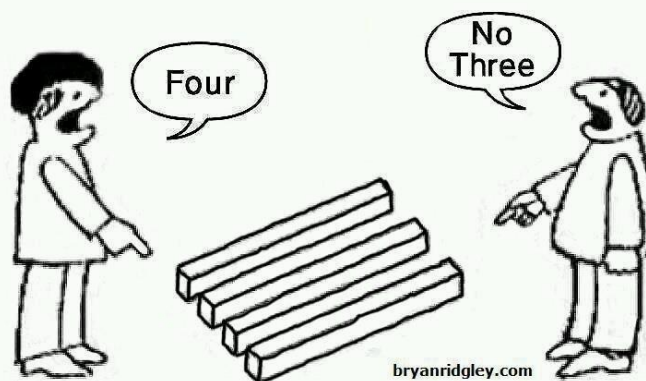
