Rotary Club of South Bunbury



Humanitarian, author, business owner, landscaper, cyclist, submariner and South Bunbury Rotary Club Past President
Tony has now written 4 novels and is working on a 5th.

Lee introduced Tony as the guest speaker and read out parts of Tony's CV which gave an insight into Tony's varied work history and his extensive voluntary community service over many areas and years.

Tony is an advocate for cancer research and is active in Fundraising for the Harry Perkins Foundation. Harry Perkins (dcd) was a former CEO of Wesfarmers and was a big benefactor of cancer research.

Tony's fundraising includes riding his bike in funding rides over hundreds of kms. In 2018 Tony picked up a bicycle and rode 1011km with fellow Rotarian Dave Castro to raise money for Solaris Cancer Care and Lift the Lid on Mental Health.

Leaving from Bunbury on June 7 2018, the pair rode to Busselton, Margaret River, Manjimup, Albany, Arthur River, Darkan and Collie in 13 days, raising \$14,000.

Tony is a member of the RC of South Bunbury. His talk focused on the breakthrough cancer research that has recently occurred here in Perth.

One of the research outcomes that has excited cancer researchers worldwide is that honey bee venom can kill in a very short time (around 1 hour in testing) active cancer cells from an array of cancer types.

With a mammoth bike ride coming up Tony spoke of his fundraising and invites donations in support of his ride for cancer.

Tony Critchley cancer ride MACA 200 with Woodside

Why ride the MACA 200 for cancer research? Easy question, because without research we'll never conquer cancer, or have better treatments or outcomes.

My old man died of Lung cancer, many years ago. My sister -in -law died from Leukemia.

My daughter -in-law had lower colon cancer, now in remission. My daughter had breast cancer, double mastectomy, still having treatment. I sat with my daughter a couple of times while she had chemo.

Please help me, help the Perkins.

I'm riding to beat cancer

Everyone has been touched by cancer. Whether it's through a loved one, friend, family member or it's much more personal, cancer is a terrible burden.

So, 2021 is my time to do something big to beat cancer. I'm committing to the MACA Cancer 200 Ride for Research because no one should have to hear those two life-altering words, "It's cancer."

I'm determined to help the amazing cancer researchers at WA's Harry Perkins Institute of Medical Research. I'm training, fundraising and riding 200km to support this cause. And I'd be so grateful for your support.

If you can't join me (I'd love the company), please give generously to my fundraising page.

The Perkins is dedicated to helping keep our families healthy and together for longer. They're focused on pioneering medical breakthroughs and discovering new treatments for this disease and they won't stop until cancer is history. That means so much to me.
