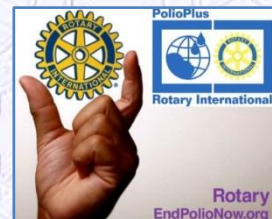

Guest Speaker

Gavin Denz

This week we enjoyed a thumbnail presentation from one of our newer members, Gavin Denz. Since joining our club earlier this year Gavin has readily immersed himself in club activities in between coping with work and family commitments.

Gavin was born in Wellington, New Zealand, in 1974. Like all good New Zealanders, he is a proud supporter of the All Blacks rugby team. Gavin described himself as being very lucky whilst he was growing up – had great parents, attended a local school, and was involved in a number of sporting activities such as hockey and surf lifesaving.

After leaving school at the end of Year 10, Gavin decided to go skiing and subsequently took himself off to the local ski fields for six months. Following this he travelled to Austria in Europe for more skiing activity. Gavin spent three months travelling, then went to England where he lived and worked in a pub for nine months.

Upon returning to New Zealand, Gavin enrolled in cooking skill as he had recognized that a chef's qualification would be very beneficial whilst travelling as he could easily pick up work as required. Although he enjoyed the work, he quickly learnt that chefs aren't paid the highest wages! However, Gavin completed the training and went on to work in approximately 200 kitchens around New Zealand and Australia. Work was obtained through an agency, and Gavin worked in a range of settings such as hotels, holiday resorts, mining camps, hospitals and cafes. Eventually Gavin came to Brisbane, where he obtained a job working for the Queensland Maroons at the Brisbane City Travel Lodge. From Brisbane Gavin came to WA, where he had always wanted to be on account of its reputation for being the second-best place in the world for wind-surfing. After a stint in WA, Gavin moved to Canberra where he worked at the Park Royal Hotel for two years. He then moved to Sydney at the time of the Sydney Olympics in 2000, and worked at the Haines Bush Stadium for six months. Seeking a more relaxed pace of life, Gavin moved back to WA and spent some time in Geraldton before choosing Perth as a base.

Having worked in the catering industry for a number of years, Gavin then opted for a career change and thus spent time working in the mining industry. Initially he was cooking, but then took up laboring work. For a period of time he worked in Perth in an operations role for an agency, which he enjoyed as it gave him the opportunity to help others. Gavin then returned to work in the mines for four years until being made redundant.

Currently, Gavin works as an Assets Support Officer for Uniting Care West, where his work involves looking after buildings. He has worked as a support officer/worker, working with people with disabilities. Recently he had the thrill of being nominated for Support Worker of the Year. Although he didn't win the final award, it was an honour to be nominated.

On a personal level, Gavin is married to wife Megan, and they have two young children – Chloe and Luke. Gavin greatly enjoys giving back to the community, hence his keenness to be involved in Rotary. Despite his love of sports, he eventually had to stop regular sports activity as he kept hurting himself!

We look forward to Gavin's continued involvement in Rotary in the months ahead.
