





### **Club Services Report 10th September 2012**



First, well done to Harry for arranging the brewery and wine tour to Harvey. It was a wonderful day out, the weather was perfect and the scenery was magnificent. Also, a big thank you to our driver Eric, who had to put up with lots of smart remarks from the back of the bus. I am sure all who attended had a great day.

We have received \$1250.00 through RAWCS, from the Rotary Club of West Swan, to be used for our Club's project in East Timor. These funds came to us through Dr Kevin Carthew and the Viet Kids WA project that we were involved with three years ago. The \$1250 were excess funds from Dr Carthew's project. The Rotary Club of West Swan cannot draw on this money, as there are tax implications involved.

On the completion of the Viet Kids WA project, Dr Carthew recommended our Club's East Timor project to be the recipient of the funds

The District's Future Vision training is to be held on Saturday 27<sup>th</sup> October (full day) followed by PEPS on Sunday 28<sup>th</sup> October (half day). The venue is the Ocean Clipper Inn in Rockingham. It is recommended that President-Elect and Foundation Director, or person responsible for grant management, attend this course.



Tonight PP Eric Blogg. Joined Rotary September 1989

Born Newcastle Upon Tyne UK in 1943, parents were employed in munitions manufacture.

Mother's brother emigrated to Perth, Australia in 1949, Blogg family decided to follow and applied in 1951, after going through all the formalities were accepted and a sailing date was set for 1953. Only receive notice that the destination was to be Sydney as there was no work in WA. Father refused the option and stuck with WA, told that if Sydney was rejected then he needed to reapply. Did so and finally sailed from Tilbury April 1955 arriving Fremantle May 15<sup>th</sup> 1955.

Dad took up a position with BP Refinery Kwinana within 2 weeks, having turned down a trade position with an Engineering company in Kewdale and accepted a laboring job with BP because a house in Medina came with the job.

Attended Medina Primary School and then Medina Junior High, much to my parents dismay I asked to leave school at 14 years old and run on a 'milk round' being an 'only child' I got my way and started work on the milk round at £3 a week. After about 12 months and under pressure from home I secured an apprenticeship as a bookbinder in Fremantle where I completed a five year trade course in the bookbinding trade.

Gladys and I married in 1964, subsequently had two children, a boy then 2 years later a girl. I stayed with this trade for about nine years before being offered \$10 per week more to drive a truck for my wife's brother in law, carting fuel and oils to the Rockingham district for the Shell Oil Company. After about two years I was presented with the option by the people I left school to work for, of buying a milk round in Medina. The amount involved was some 2.5 times the value of the house we had just built in Calista Avenue. Having no capital to invest the total amount was financed and I became involved in the Dairy Industry which was to last for 30 years.

Delivered milk to households in Medina and Orelia until the late seventies when we bought out the original owners of the milk business in Kwinana and concentrated on shop or wholesale trade. This continued until the early nineties when deregulation of the Dairy Industry was looming. Although very displeased with our security of licence being taken away we embarked on a contract system with Brownes Dairy. Things could not have worked out better, after another huge investment in plant we almost tripled the size of our business, employed 8 people and a turnover in excess of \$5 million per annum.

The opportunity existed to downsize and sell part of our business, we did in 1996, and continued to sell by finally selling the last segment in 1997. I am happy to tell people that the 'cards fell the right way' and we were rewarded for 30 years of hard work. Incidentally I would not like to be involved in the Milk Distribution business today.

Gladys and I are immensely proud of our children's achievements with our son Michael living in Melbourne and very involved in Information Technology, and daughter Julie being a Consultant Pharmacist as well as a Major in the Australian Army and the mother of our beautiful twin granddaughters.

#### GUEST SPEAKER

**Susie Dwyer** –Susie is the Manager of the Kwinana pools and recreation centre. The old Kwinana pools were 30 years old and were beginning to breakdown and fall apart. Recognising the need to replace them a proposal was put together and took 3 years to get funding. Building commenced in Aug 2001 and until July 2002 staff of the parts of the rec centre that were still operational were forced to operate out of a store room as the main offices and reception area were demolished.

Upon completion the pools were filled and subsequently emptied to repair a fault however everything is now up and running with the hydrotherapy pool to open shortly. The range of facilities includes a 10 lane, 25 metre pool, leisure pool (kids pool), spa, steam room, aerobics / gym, martial arts room, crèche and café. The usual array of health and exercise programs are on offer so get down and check out the facilities.
