### 5.4 Vocational Service

#### 5.4.1 Four-Way Test Speech Competition

Each year, under the coordination of the Vocational Service Manager, the Club will contact local secondary schools to gauge interest from staff and students for the District Four-Way Test Speaking Competition. Should there be appropriate interest, the Vocational Service Manager will coordinate the project and the Club will pay the project expenses.

### 5.5 International Service

#### 5.5.1 East Timor (Timor Leste)

The Rotary Club of Kwinana will ensure that all the equipment received from the Rotary Club of Doncaster, associated Rotary Clubs and the East Timor Roofing Company, for the RAWCS project 'Water for the Hungry Mouths' (WFTHM) will remain within Timor Leste. The equipment is only to be used for projects and activities approved by the RAWCS 21-2011-12 and the WFTHM international committees.

This equipment will be assigned to RAWCS 21-2011-12 International Committee (Rotary Club of Kwinana) during the month of August 2015. At that stage standing order 34 East Timor (Timor Leste) with a full inventory including the 4x4 ute, Drill Rig, assorted drilling tools, bore casings, power tools, hand tools including two sea containers, will come into force.

#### Relay for Life update

Relay For Life is a fun 24 hour community event to help raise vital funds for the Cancer Council's WA life changing research, prevention and support services. This event is a chance for our amazing community and surrounding communities to come together and help celebrate those who have overcome their battle or are currently undergoing treatment. This is also an event to help honour the memory of those one who we have lost.

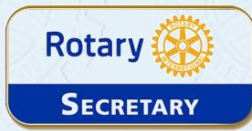


Genevieve attended planning meeting on Monday 10 September.

- Relay for Life will take place from 10am Saturday 6 October until 10am Sunday 7 October at Calista Oval.
- Registration of team will take place from 8am onwards on Saturday 6 October; team captain to collect information bag
- All teams are allocated a 3m x 3m bay to pitch a tent and use as a base; we are able to use space behind as required for extra tents, etc.
- There will be a range of stalls at the event, with funds raised being donated to Relay for Life. There will be a 24/24 barbeque stall; from 5pm – 9pm on Saturday there will be additional food stalls selling curries, roast beef rolls, pasta.
- Teams are able to do fundraising within their own tent e.g. cake stall; can notify organisers so that they can publicize it during the event.
- Candlelight ceremony to take place during the Saturday evening in honour of people who have passed away due to cancer. We are able to submit a photo of a loved one who has passed for display.
- No gas or fires allowed; solar lights permitted.
- There will be a range of kids activities, with qualified staff looking after children.

At the moment there is a 1/2 price special on registration for the team \$20 for adults and \$10 for children; use the code HNYSM2018.

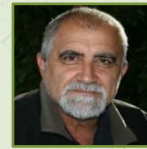

### Polio This Week 4<sup>th</sup> September 2018

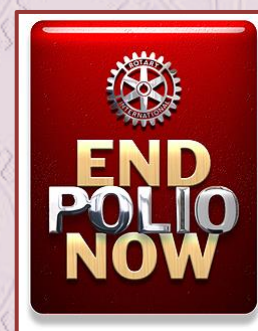

Josh came through the KIC Education Partnership.

The KIC Education Partnership was established to build and strengthen relationships, implement projects and improve the connection between Kwinana industries and regional education providers.

**Career Pathway Programs:** These are a range of activities that relate to ways in which Year 11 and Year 12 students gain ongoing practical work experience in industry. Practical experience in the workplace teaches students about what it means to be a worker in terms of what is expected of them and what they can expect of the host employer. It is a great way for students to move across into a job when they are ready to do so.

Josh competed in the WA State Training Awards and won the category of School Based Apprentice of the Year. Josh went on to compete with Team WA in the 2018 WorldSkills Australia National Championships.

**Joshua Semper wins Bronze:** Over the long weekend of June 2, 3 and 4 June, Joshua Semper was in Sydney representing Western Australia and Gilmore College with distinction at the WorldSkills Australia, VETis Metals and Engineering competition. The competition which was held at the International Convention Centre at Darling Harbour was a keenly contested event which saw students and apprentices from Western Australia competing against representatives from all other states in a range of skills and trades

In preparation for the competition Joshua spent many hours after school practicing the skill sets required to achieve success. In addition, he also attended night classes at South Metro TAFE working with Peter Longworth to hone his welding skills.

During the competition Joshua performed admirably, even helping the ultimate winner in the final hour of competition. It is this level of selflessness that makes Joshua the fine young man that he is, and a person the College and Community can be extremely proud of for the manner in which he represented all of us. 'Oh Jeysus Christ, ye thick sod, take the No. 14 and we'll walk from the roundabout.

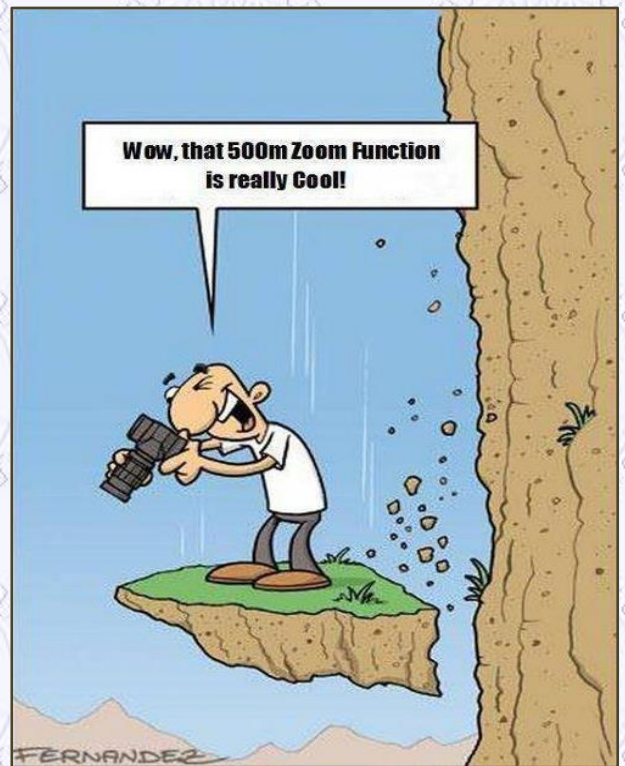
"I watched my wife's routine at breakfast for years," the expert explained.
