Polio this week

16th October 2023

The Global Polio Eradication Initiative congratulates [Dr Hanan Balkhy](#), for her nomination as the next WHO Regional Director for the Eastern Mediterranean (EMRO), and the first female Regional Director for this Region. This is a historic decision by the Member States and well-deserved. We look forward to working with her, in securing a lasting polio-free EMRO in the very near future.



European leaders pledge €500 million to deliver a healthier, polio-free world – In Brussels this week, the European Commission (EC), the European Investment Bank (EIB) and the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation (BMGF), along with the World Health Organization (WHO) and the United Nations Children’s Fund (UNICEF) announced a new financing partnership of over €1 billion to advance polio eradication efforts and strengthen healthcare systems. This partnership will provide €500 million in new funding to the Global Polio Eradication Initiative (GPEI) – specifically to its implementing partners, WHO and UNICEF – and €500 million to programmes that expand innovation and research capacity in low- and middle-income countries. - Afghanistan: six WPV1-positive environmental samples
- Pakistan: one WPV1 case and four WPV1-positive environmental samples
- Algeria: one cVDPV2-positive environmental sample
- Cameroon: one cVDPV2-positive environmental sample
- Chad: one cVDPV2 case
- DR Congo: 12 cVDPV1 cases, seven cVDPV2 cases and six cVDPV2-positive environmental samples
- Guinea: two cVDPV2 cases and one cVDPV2-positive environmental sample
- Nigeria: two cVDPV2 cases and five cVDPV2-environmental samples

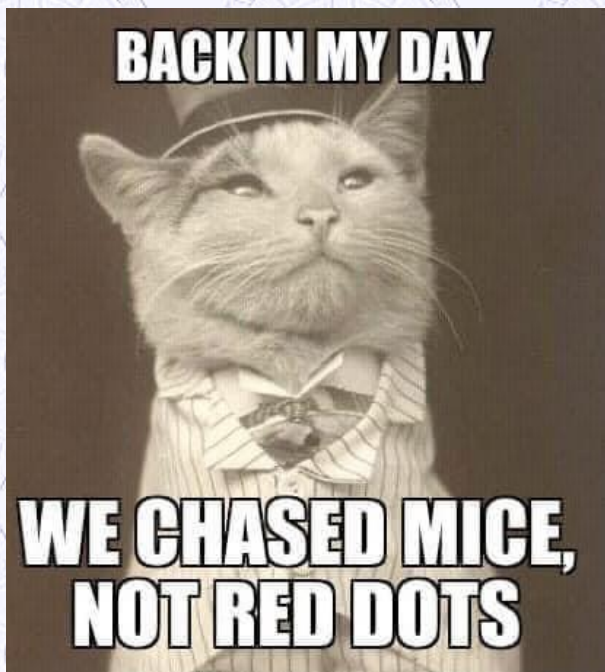
