

Relay for Life update

Relay For Life is a fun 24 hour community event to help raise vital funds for the Cancer Council's WA life changing research, prevention and support services. This event is a chance for our amazing community and surrounding communities to come together and help celebrate those who have overcome their battle or are currently undergoing treatment. This is also an event to help honour the memory of those one who we have lost.



Genevieve attended planning meeting on Monday 10 September.

- Relay for Life will take place from 10am Saturday 6 October until 10am Sunday 7 October at Calista Oval.
- Registration of team will take place from 8am onwards on Saturday 6 October; team captain to collect information bag
- All teams are allocated a 3m x 3m bay to pitch a tent and use as a base; we are able to use space behind as required for extra tents, etc.
- There will be a range of stalls at the event, with funds raised being donated to Relay for Life. There will be a 24/24 barbeque stall; from 5pm 9pm on Saturday there will be additional food stalls selling curries, roast beef rolls, pasta.
- Teams are able to do fundraising within their own tent e.g. cake stall; can notify organisers so that they can publicize it during the event.
- Candlelight ceremony to take place during the Saturday evening in honour of people who have passed away due to cancer. We are able to submit a photo of a loved one who has passed for display.
- No gas or fires allowed; solar lights permitted.
- There will be a range of kids activities, with qualified staff looking after children.

At the moment there is a 1/2 price special on registration for the team \$20 for adults and \$10 for children; use the code HNYSM2018.

Polio This Week 11th September 2018

- Summary of new viruses this week:
- Afghanistan One new case of wild poliovirus (WPV1).
- Pakistan One new case of wild poliovirus (WPV1).
- Papua New Guinea three new cases of circulating vaccine-derived poliovirus type 1 (cVDPV1).
- Somalia two new cases of circulating vaccine-derived poliovirus type 2 (cVDPV2).
- Afghanistan and Pakistan continue to detect WPV1 through environmental sampling, indicating sustained transmission. See country sections below for more details.
- The Johns Hopkins University is leading a project to document lessons learned from GPEI, and translating those lessons to improve delivery of other lifesaving health programs and strengthening health systems globally
- Featured on www.polioeradication.org: Coffee with Polio Experts Anand Balachandran of WHO talks about how to ensure that the infrastructure built up to eradicate polio will continue to benefit broader public health goals, long after the disease has been eradicated.

Guest Speaker:

Theresa Walley, Rose Walley and Cheryl Martin Kwinana Noongar Community.

Theresa Walley, was born in Kellerberrin on the 6th of November 1937. She was one of nine children born to Mary Theresa Indich and Luis Winmar.

At the tender age of seven, she with several of her family were placed in the care of the Carrolup Mission.

Mary and her children absconded and Theresa ended up in St Joseph's orphanage at New Norcia. Here she received a very restricted upbringing so was totally unprepared for life when she was put outside the doors with a suitcase. She found a job as a domestic at the Quairading hospital. Eventually she met and married Leslie Robert Walley. The children to this marriage are Trevor, Robert, Doreen, Cheryl, Rosemary, Charmaine and Christopher (deceased).

Now a great grandmother, Theresa's life has been one of survival, bringing up children, working and constantly researching the background of her culture.

Rather than retire, now with the duties of "Elder" she is constantly on call and in great demand. Her love of her fellow indigenous peoples, especially the young, is very evident in the many projects in which she is involved, including tourism where she guest speaks, does educational bushwalks and demonstrates the values of bush-tucker.

Theresa has authored and illustrated several books about Noongar culture and traditional stories. In this book Theresa invited her daughter Cheryl and granddaughter Biara to do the paintings for two of the stories.

Welcome to Country.

Welcome to Country is a ceremony that formally welcomes people to the land. It is an important cultural protocol that is 40,000 years old, dating back to the Dreamtime, and it is deeply respected by Aboriginal people.

Incorporating Welcomes to Country and Acknowledgements of Country into events shows awareness of and respect for the traditional owners of the land where the event is being held. It can help to build relationships with local Aboriginal people and to increase awareness of the Aboriginal culture and protocols within the wider community.


It also publicly recognises the ongoing connection of Aboriginal people with their country.

A Welcome needs to be performed by a representative who has traditional local links to a particular place, area or region. In Perth, a Welcome should be performed by Elders of the Whadjuk Nyoongar people.






ABORIGINAL GROUPS OF THE SOUTH WEST OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA



In South West WA, the Noongar seasonal calendar includes six different seasons in a yearly cycle. Each of the six seasons represents and explains the seasonal changes we see annually. The Noongar seasons can be long or short and are indicated by what is happening and changing around us rather than by dates on a calendar.



The Noongar Seasons


- Birak (Dec-Jan): Dry and hot. Also known as Season of the Young.
- Bunuru (Feb-Mar): Hottest part of the year. Also known as Season of Adolescence.
- Djeran (Apr-May): Cooler weather begins. Also known as Season of Adulthood.
- Makuru (Jun-Jul): Coldest and wettest time of the year; more frequent gales and storms. Also known as Fertility Season.
- Djilba (Aug-Sept): Mixture of wet days with increasing number of clear, cold nights and pleasant warmer days. Also known as Season of Conception.
- Kambarang (Oct-Nov): Longer dry periods. Also known as Season of Birth.

Worldwide, 20,000 brands of beer are brewed in 180 styles, from ales, lagers, pilsner and stouts to bitters, cream ales and iced beers.

Beer has been a popular beverage for a long time. Babylonian clay tablets show detailed recipes of beer making in 4300 BC. Beer was also brewed by the ancient Chinese, Assyrians and Incas.

An Egyptian text of 1600 BC gives 100 medical prescriptions using beer. A few years ago, the Newcastle Brewery in England brewed 1,000 bottles Tutankhamun Ale from a 3,200-year old recipe found in the sun temple of Queen Nefertiti.

Commercial beer making was established in 1200 AD in what is now Germany. In 1506, the German Purity Law is issued, specifying that beer ingredients must only be water, barley, wheat and hops. Bottling of beer started in 1605.
