This event is a chance for our amazing community and surrounding communities to come together and help celebrate those who have overcome their battle or are currently undergoing treatment. This is also an event to help honour the memory of those one who we have lost.

Relay for Life will take place from 10am Saturday 6 October until 10am Sunday 7 October at Calista Oval.

- Registration of team will take place from 8am onwards on Saturday 6 October; team captain to collect information bag
- All teams are allocated a 3m x 3m bay to pitch a tent and use as a base; we are able to use space behind as required for extra tents, etc.
- There will be a range of stalls at the event, with funds raised being donated to Relay for Life. There will be a 24/24 barbeque stall; from 5pm – 9pm on Saturday there will be additional food stalls selling curries, roast beef rolls, pasta.
- Teams are able to do fundraising within their own tent e.g. cake stall; can notify organisers so that they can publicize it during the event.
- Candlelight ceremony to take place during the Saturday evening in honour of people who have passed away due to cancer. We are able to submit a photo of a loved one who has passed for display.
- No gas or fires allowed; solar lights permitted.
- There will be a range of kids activities, with qualified staff looking after children.

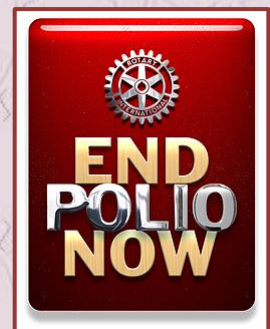
Polio This Week 25th September 2018

Two cases of circulating vaccine-derived poliovirus type 2 (cVDPV2) are reported from Niger, linked to an ongoing cVDPV2 outbreak in neighbouring Nigeria.

Featured on www.polioeradication.org: Coffee with Polio Experts – Head of WHO Chad Dr Jean-Bosco Ndiwokubwayo speaks about the ongoing efforts to reach every child with polio vaccine across Chad.

Summary of newly-reported viruses this week:

- Afghanistan – two new wild poliovirus type 1 (WPV1) positive environmental samples;
- Pakistan – five new WPV1-positive environmental samples;
- Nigeria – three cases of circulating vaccine-derived poliovirus type 2 (cVDPV2) and two cVDPV2-positive environmental samples;
- Niger – two cVDPV2 cases;
- Horn of Africa (Somalia) – three cVDPV3 cases and one cVDPV3 positive environmental sample; and,
- Papua New Guinea – two new cVDPV1 cases.

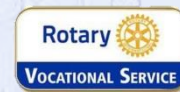


Mikala recently attended the 2018 RYPEN camp at the Baptist Serpentine Camping Centre, Jarrahdale. RYPEN stands for **Rotary Youth Programme of Enrichment** which through a weekend live in seminar for up to 45 participants, aims to create in young adults an awareness of their place in and responsibility towards, society. Participants are sponsored and paid for by the many Rotary Clubs within District 9465 who see RYPEN as a great opportunity to demonstrate their commitment to youth in their community.

RYPEN is an intensive programme which includes developing and implementing problem solving skills. At the same time participants from different backgrounds are interacting with each other and improving their teamwork skills. Activities may include a low ropes course, a team building course, workshops, games and more done in an informal atmosphere, where questions and debate are encouraged.

The Object of Rotary:

For years, Rotary's commitment to Service Above Self has been channeled through the 5 Avenues of Service, which form the foundation of club activity.

- Club Service
- Vocational Service
- Community Service
- International Service
- Youth Service

Vocational Service is one of Rotary's Avenues of **Service**. **Vocational Service** calls every Rotarian to: Aspire to high ethical standards in their occupation; recognize the worthiness of all useful occupations, and; contribute their **vocational** talents to the problems and needs of society.

When professionals join a Rotary club, they do so as a representative of their classification – their particular business or profession.

Rotarians have the dual responsibility of representing their vocation within the club and exemplifying the ideals of Rotary within the workplace.
