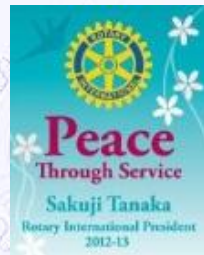

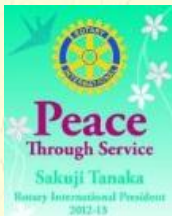

Greetings from your Acting President,

Unfortunately Nerida is unable to attend one of our Club meetings, but she wished to express her thanks. (note below from Nerida, Kwinana Community Health)

Hi there to all the members of the Rotary Club. This is just a small message of grateful thanks for the donation of books, generously donated to us by your organisation for the Aboriginal community here in Kwinana.

Over the past three years I have had the opportunity to work for the Aboriginal Health Team as a community child health nurse. In this role I have noted that many Aboriginal children have much fewer books, fewer educational opportunities and educational resources than non-Aboriginal children which is directly linked to their development of literacy skills. As you are probably aware there is quite a big gap between Aboriginal and non-Aboriginal children's achievements at school. This gap widens as they get older, often disadvantaging them in their lives beyond school.

Offering suitable age-appropriate books to Aboriginal children is a way of promoting interaction and encouraging literacy skills that will provide children with the necessary knowledge to further achieve success.

A gift of a book could therefore make all the difference for the life opportunities of a child.

Grand Final Day function at our club rooms, about 12 interested so far. 11.30 am at our club rooms. Lunch and drinks provided.

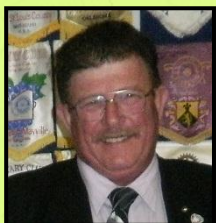

Membership Report: PP Brian McCallum

At the Board Meeting on Wednesday 19/09 a discussion was held regarding the proposal in my Membership Report to the Board on 22nd August 2012 regarding how the RC of K approaches Membership. This is a proposal only at this time and has to be approved by the Board of the RC of K.

I believe there are several Members who do not agree with this approach but nothing has been relayed to me.

I am also led to believe that several Members have a concern that both Pres. Ed & myself do not have the experience or knowledge of Rotary to conduct interviews? Pres. Ed has been in our club for 14 Years & I have been in our club 7 Years plus 3 Years in another Rotary Club & 12 Years in Lions.

Tonight PP Ian Critchley

Joined Rotary August 1989

Born in NE England in Stockton-On-Tees, Co Durham, which makes me a Teessider not a Tynesider, in November 1940, which makes me a war-baby. Dad was from the NE and mam from SE London, I could never pin mam down as to why but I was back in London as a babe-in-arms in 1941. My best guess is mam wanted to be with her family whilst dad was away at war. One story mam did tell about the London bombing was that during a raid she raced out with me to the backyard bomb shelter, only to realise she had left something in the house, so leaving me “safe” in the shelter she went back into the house only to find a bomb had exploded very near to the shelter and buried it. They dug me out and I wasn’t dead.

I spent my early childhood moving between Stockton and London; however I finished my schooling in Stockton at the age of 14 and started work as a General Apprentice at the Head-Wrightson steelworks. A general apprenticeship was one where you were put with various tradesmen to find which trade you were most suited for, I chose and it was agreed I could train to become a draughtsman and went to night school to learn technical drawing. However, it became apparent that riding my bike to work every day in all sorts of weather was not for me and I decided to join the Royal Navy and see the world.

The recruiting office was in nearby Sunderland so I took the day off, went to the office did the tests etc. and was accepted. Dad had no problems with this and signed the paperwork, so at 15 in 1956 I joined the Navy as a junior stoker and was sent to HMS Ganges, a naval training establishment similar to HMS Leeuwin in Fremantle. I finished my training in 1957 and was offered the choice of continuing training as an upper-yardsman and become an officer or join a ship, HMS Cavalier, in Singapore. I was 16 and it was no contest – I went to sea. I have often wondered how different my life would have been if I had become an officer rather than a stoker.

Without dwelling too long on my time in the Royal Navy; in 1963 when I transferred to the Royal Australian Navy, I was a well-travelled 22 year old with no commitments who was enjoying life immensely. My main seagoing drafts to HMS Cavalier, Scott and Belfast – a destroyer, survey ship and cruiser respectively; resulted in my attending a H Bomb test at Christmas Island in the Pacific and visiting many countries including – Singapore, Hong Kong, Borneo, Australia, New Zealand, Fiji, Ocean Island, Vietnam, Thailand, Scotland, Norway, India, Ceylon, East Africa, Persian Gulf, Japan, Philippines, Guam, Hawaii, America, Canada, Panama and Trinidad.

My first ship in the RAN was HMAS Vampire – I was lucky it was, my original draft was for HMAS Voyager but this was changed because my parents were living in Sydney and the Vampire was undergoing refit there. The Voyager you may recall was sunk in the 60’s by HMAS Melbourne. Australian ships at that time mainly visited place like Singapore, Hong Kong and Borneo. Up North rather than Far East

I and a my best mate Rex Brown, who became my brother-in-law, were running a crown and anchor game whilst on Vampire, and, as we were flush with cash, decided to take a trip around Australia during a leave in 1965. He was from the West and wanted to become engaged to my sister but I wouldn’t have it until he had broken off with his girlfriend who happened to live in Kwinana. Gail was a good friend of this girl and that is how I met Gail. We were married in Sydney in 1967 just before I sailed for Vietnam aboard HMAS Sydney. I did 3 trips and was then drafted to a shore base HMAS Penguin, We lived in Sydney until 1969 when I was discharged and Gail gave an ultimatum; I could come West with her or stay in Sydney without her, I came West.

I tried for a job at BP but my face didn’t fit, so I tried for Alcoa and was successful. I was only there for a few months when I heard of a position at CSBP, got the job and stayed there for 31 years until I retired in 2000. Commencing as an acid plant operator, I went on to become a leading plant operator, shift supervisor, plant foreman, emergency response chief and finished as the safety coordinator. Hence my classification is Industrial Safety. Although I was at CSBP nearly 3 times as long as I was in the Navy, it is the RN & RAN that I have a much greater involvement with on retirement.

On my family life I have 3 daughters, all born in Kwinana, and 5 grand kids. I also have a son Paul, who I didn’t know about until the late 90’s when I received a letter from him telling me he believed I was his natural father. I was! And we have a good relationship. He has been out here a couple of times and some of you have met him, we will be meeting up again next month in Southampton. Since we retired Gail and I have travelled extensively, revisiting some of the places I visited as a sailor and many I did not.
