

Max is at present in East Timor.

The international Committee is carrying out the following.

1. Worked with a group of Rotarians from *Phillip Island* and installed a Skyhydrant water filter capable of filtering 10,000 litres of water per day. The 5/600 students and teachers at SOL's 24/7 in Dili now have clean drinking water
2. Started work at *Baguia, Larisul and Bubuha* and the work is progressing very well at this stage
3. Two other remote villages have also asked for assistance in gaining a reliable potable water supply to their communities
4. We met up with Brother Peter Corr from the Marist Brothers and discussed his proposal for supplying water to a new school to be built at Lautem on the east end of the Island for about 500+ students, for once this school will not be built without a reliable water supply,

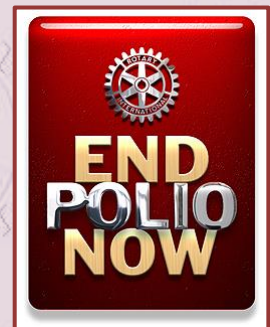
Polio This Week 09th October 2018

Papua New Guinea's National Department of Health, WHO, UNICEF and partners issue a '100 Days Report': featuring the highlights of response operations so far, the report is dedicated to the thousands of front-line polio workers who brave difficult conditions and work long hours to protect children in Papua New Guinea from polio.

The G20 group of countries keeps polio eradication in their priorities: in their statement following the G20 Health Ministerial meeting, Ministers recognize "the importance of eradicating polio" and planning for a sustainable polio-free world.

World Polio Day is coming up on 24 October: join partners around the world in making this year's World Polio Day a success.

Summary of newly-reported viruses this week:
no new cases of wild poliovirus and five new cases of circulating vaccine-derived poliovirus (cVDPV);
Niger – one new case of cVDPV2;
Nigeria – two new cases of cVDPV2;
Somalia – one new case of cVDPV2;
Papua New Guinea – one new case of cVDPV1.
Positive samples from environmental surveillance: wild poliovirus in Pakistan (10); cVDPV2 in Somalia (1).

Chris Oughton

Director: Kwinana Industries Council



Promoting and contributing to the sustainable co-existence of the Kwinana Industry, the Community and the Environment



The Kwinana Industries Council (KIC) is an incorporated business association with membership drawn from the Kwinana Industrial Area (KIA). It is the premier industrial estate in Western Australia, covering an area approximately 8km north-south and 2km east-west, on the eastern side of Cockburn Sound some 30km south of the Perth CBD.

KIC's Education Development Program:

The KIC Education Development Program is about showing high school students in the region the sorts of careers that are available in industry, and working with them in a practical sense how they might aspire to these sorts of careers.

There are two streams under the Education Development Program; the first is the iProjects stream, and the second is the Career Pathways Programs stream.

KIC has won some international awards for its Education Development Program, and Chris is heading off to Houston next week where he has been asked to speak at a conference where the awards will be given out. He will be mentioning the sponsorship that the Rotary Club of Kwinana gives to the Metals and Engineering part of the program.

Westport:

Chris provided a general update about the progress of the Westport taskforce.

Westport is the project set up by the government to deliver a new freight port for the container and bulk trade currently being delivered via the Fremantle Port.

He spoke about his frustrations about the overly negative evaluation for the new port in Cockburn Sound, indicating he will write KIC's next advertorial in the Sound Telegraph on this subject later this month.



Lithium Valley:

Chris explained the concept of Lithium Valley and what it means not only for Kwinana and the industrial area, but also for the economic development of the State.

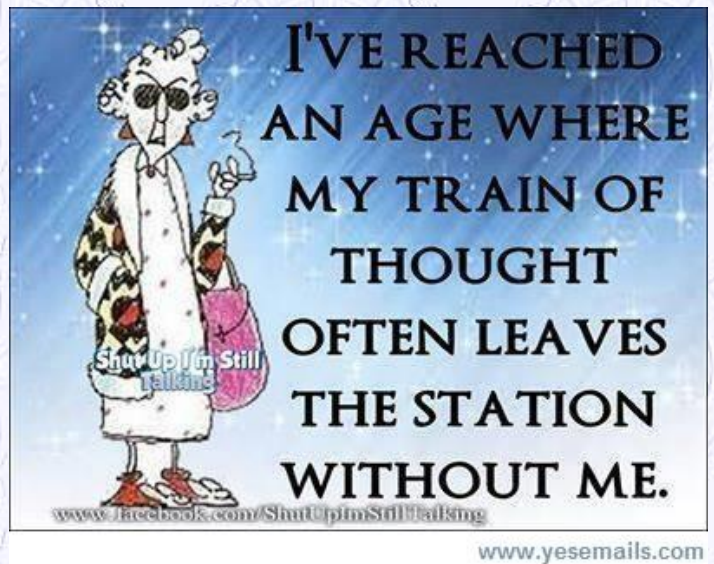
He explained that he had hosted tours of the industrial area for potential new industrial entrants from around the world and that they were wanting to become a part of the entire value chain for this new industrial phenomenon from production of concentrate right through to storage battery production.
