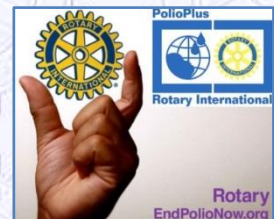

Personality of the Week

Bruce Lynch

Bruce Lynch is the 8th District Governor of District 9465. Accompanying Bruce to all his duties is his wife of 43 years, Glenda. Bruce and Glenda have a son and a daughter, and one grand-daughter.

Bruce comes to us as a member of South Bunbury Rotary.

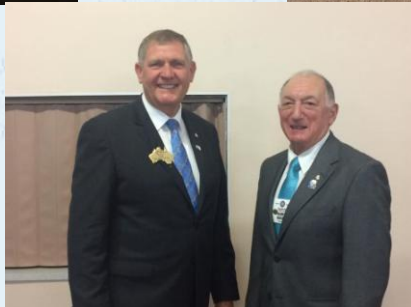
Bruce says from a previous life he served the building industry as a registered builder, and together with Glenda ran a fabrication business in Bunbury, providing framed construction to the residential and commercial markets of WA.

Bruce spent his early years growing up in Hamilton Hill, and moved to regional Bunbury on a work transfer nearly 40 years ago. Bruce says, 'You can take the boy out of Fremantle but you can't take the Fremantle out of the boy.' Bruce loves to visit Fremantle, and admits to being an avid supporter of the Fremantle Dockers. Glenda is originally from Collie.

Bruce and Glenda have retired from business, but Bruce still manages to keep involved with two local building companies as their registered builder and compliance officer. But most of his spare time is taken up volunteering to local not-for-profit community groups, including Men's Shed, and is an active Justice of the Peace.

Bruce joined South Bunbury Rotary in 1993 and since then has been a very active club member holding office for most of that time, including District participation and youth programs. Bruce has a passion for helping other people succeed, and achieves a real buzz from watching people grow.

Bruce says he is well supported by fellow members of South Bunbury Rotary who welcome the opportunity for him not to be around for twelve months.





Guest Speaker

2017 – 2018 District Governor Bruce Lynch

DG Bruce, introduced by PDG John Iriks, presented an outline of current Rotary activity.

At present, the Rotary structure is headed by communities, in which there are Rotarians who belong to clubs. Clubs are organized into Districts based on their location, and the clubs within a District are organized into Groups. Globally there are Rotary International Zones, with everything being a part of Rotary International.

The Rotary theme for 2017-2018 is **Rotary: Making a Difference**. The emphasis is that for every \$1, every hour you put into the community, you are making a difference. The logo for this year's theme consists of a circle, which represents the world, and different coloured figures within the circle which represent the multicultural aspect of Rotary.

Key points for the 2017-2018 Strategic Plan are as follows:

1. Support and strengthen clubs
2. Focus and increase humanitarian service
3. Enhance public image and awareness.

RI President Ian Riseley has set a challenge for every Rotarian to plant at least one tree by 22 April 2018.

Membership is an ongoing issue for Rotary. At present the percentage of membership is 23% female, and 77% male. Rotary aims to increase female membership to become more balanced.

Much time and attention is being given to public image, both for the sake of increasing membership, and for making the general community aware of Rotary activity. One suggestion made has been for all Rotarians to wear their club shirt on 23 February (Rotary's anniversary!) every year to help promote the organization. Uniformity is an important feature. The Rotary logo was updated several years ago and consists of a gold Rotary wheel, with the word "Rotary" written in blue beside it. An initiative of our District has been to create advertising of Rotary on trucks, with explanation of what we do and offer – including friendship, volunteering, self-development. There has also been a billboard created for advertising on trailers. Rotary has a strong partnership with Rotaract, which has its own special logo.

At present the most important priority for the Rotary Foundation is **End Polio Now**. At the start of the 2017-2018 Rotary year there were 35 registered cases of polio throughout the world. Shortly afterwards there were only 9 cases, but the figure has now risen to 25 registered cases in three countries. Since the establishment of End Polio Now in 1987, there has been a 99.9% reduction in cases of polio worldwide. However, if we do not proceed with the program it is anticipated that there could be up to 200,000 polio cases in 10 years' time.

Bruce is encouraging all Rotarians to attend District Conference in Margaret River in March 2018. Conference will be held at the Quality Inn. There will be a youth discount for Rotarians aged 35 years and under!

To conclude, Bruce gave the quote:

"I cannot do all the good that the world needs. But the world needs all the good that I can do."
