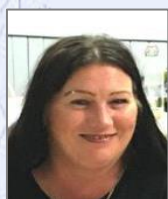

## Polio this week

6<sup>th</sup> November 2023

“Where I work, people have poor understanding of health matters, especially around vaccines. They fear vaccines, they fear us, the polio workers. I explain to them: I’m here for you, for the health and safety of your children. I’m here despite the intense heat and the biting cold. When you refuse to vaccinate, it is the children who will suffer the most. My only motivation is that children and families are spared the suffering of polio,” Gulzar Ahmed Khan, a 28-year-old polio social mobilizer in Pakistan. [Read more](#)...+

- Nigeria: nine cVDPV2 cases and one positive environmental sample
- Somalia: one cVDPV2 case

- **Method of making a personal contribution to the Rotary Foundation**
- **All Centurion contributions from Rotarians count towards their club's Annual Giving total.**
- **100% of the funds are used for Areas of Focus projects, both locally and internationally.**
- **Of the funds contributed, 50% goes to the World Fund, and the other 50% comes back to our District in three years' time to support District Grants, Global Grants, Vocational Training Teams, Areas of focus Scholarships.**
- **Your donation accrues PHF points, which you can be awarded or may be transferred to someone else of your choice.**
- **The money is paid into the Australian Rotary Trust Fund, making your contribution tax-deductible.**
- **Your commitment simply entails contributing A\$100 per year as long as you are able to.**

## How to pay

There are several options for making payment:

1. **Authorise the Australian Rotary Trust fund to automatically Direct Debit your bank or credit card account.**
2. **Set up recurring payments by EFT in your online banking system**
3. **Pay by cheque annually**
4. **Make your payment along with other Club members**

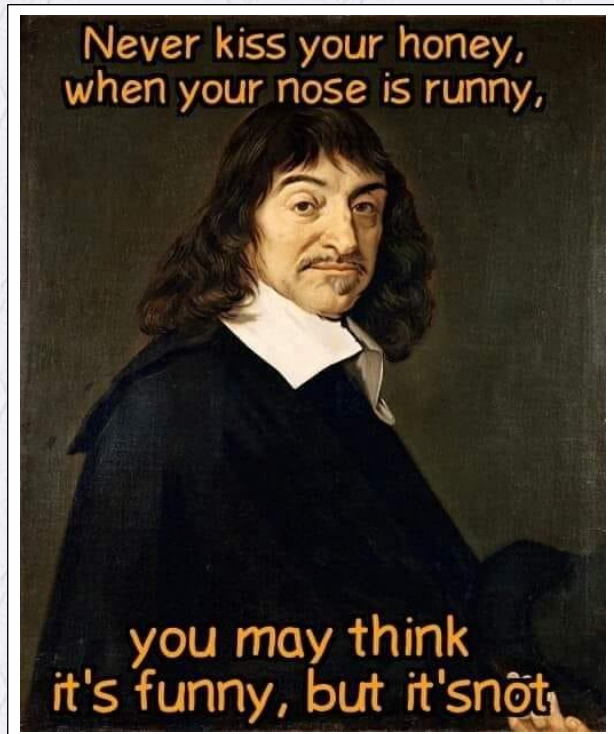
