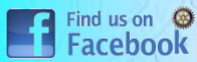

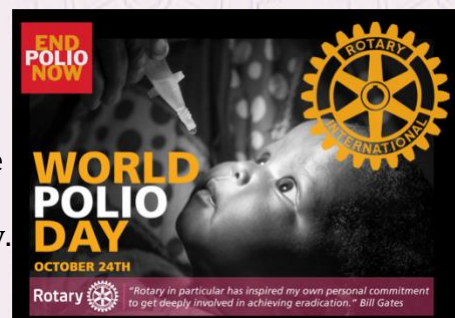
History of World Polio Day

Established by the Rotary International to commemorate the birth of Jonas Salk, the medical researcher who led the first team to develop a vaccine against polio, World Polio Day has been observed for over a decade now. He developed the inactivated poliovirus vaccine which came into use in 1955, after which Albert Sabin developed the oral polio vaccine which came into use in 1961.

The establishment of the Global Polio Eradication Initiative (GPEI) happened in 1988, launched by the Rotary International and the WHO, when there were nearly 3,50,000 cases of polio across the world.

As of date, several regions like the Americas, Europe, Southeast Asia, and Western Pacific have been declared polio-free. However, countries like Pakistan and Afghanistan still witness rare occurrences of this disease.

World Polio Day, therefore, is the perfect occasion to spread awareness about the dangers of this disease, and the immense need to vaccinate babies as per schedule, so as to completely eradicate the virus.

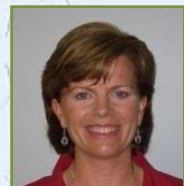

Disaster Aid Australia (DAA) has just been notified that Bhutan 2020 has been selected for a National Award by the [Energy Globe Awards](#).

The awards, organised by the Energy Globe Foundation, are the most prominent worldwide environmental project recognition.

It's a great that we have been chosen, from 2,500 entries worldwide, to receive one of the 180 National Awards.

This recognises that this project delivers safe water in a sustainable way across the whole of Bhutan.

Key Aspects of the Project

The project, which will shortly be completed, is much more than a DAA project, and could not have been achieved without:

- The Rotary Club of Thimphu who first approached DAA in 2017 and have since been working continuously on in-country liaison.
- The Bhutan Government that have provided ongoing support through their Education Department.
- The Installation Team from the School Planning and Building Division.
- The SkyHydrants, from the SkyJuice Foundation, that provide safe drinking water without the use of electrical power.
- The generous support of Australian Rotary Clubs and individual supporters.

The Global Polio Eradication Initiative is a public-private partnership led by national governments with six partners – the World Health Organization (WHO), **Rotary International**, the US Centres for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), the United Nations Children’s Fund (UNICEF), Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation and Gavi, the vaccine alliance. Its goal is to eradicate polio worldwide.

House-to-house polio vaccination set to recommence across Afghanistan in November

WHO and UNICEF welcome the decision by the Taliban leadership supporting the resumption of house-to-house polio vaccination across Afghanistan.

The vaccination campaign, which begins on November 8, will be the first in over three years to reach all children in Afghanistan, including more than 3.3 million children in some parts of the country who have previously remained inaccessible to vaccination campaigns. A second nationwide polio vaccination campaign has also been agreed and will be synchronised with Pakistan’s own polio campaign planned in December.

With only one case of wild poliovirus reported so far in 2021, Afghanistan has an extraordinary opportunity to eradicate polio. Restarting polio vaccination now is crucial for preventing any significant resurgence of polio within the country and mitigating the risk of cross-border and international transmission.

At the Jarrahdale Tavern Stephen C received his meal first, Piggy Cyril and John W decided to help him eat his chips.

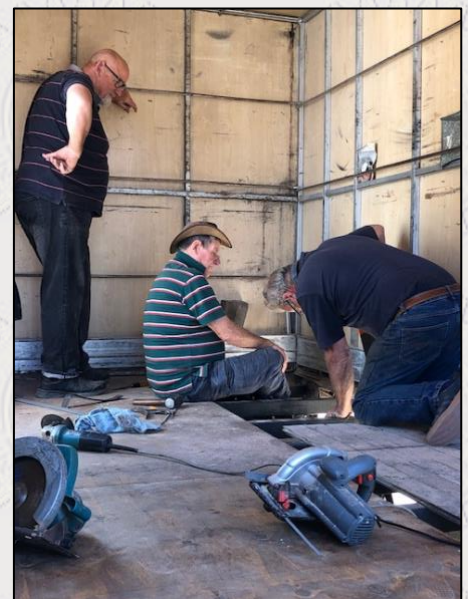
Kim B: Stated that the date of the Bathurst 1000 was definitely whatever, so she Googled it to prove it, wrong, date had been changed to November.

Polio this week

13th October 2021

In Ukraine, one case of polio caused by circulating vaccine-derived poliovirus type 2 (cVDPV2), has been confirmed. A cVDPV2 was isolated from a 17-month old girl with acute flaccid paralysis, from Rivne province (in the north-west of the country), and from six healthy contacts (siblings of the girl). Following careful review of safety and genetic stability data from mass immunization campaigns conducted with the novel oral polio vaccine type 2 (nOPV2), the [Strategic Advisory Group of Experts on immunization \(SAGE\)](#) endorsed the transition to the next use phase for the vaccine.
