Guest Speaker's

Max Bird, Tom Hoyer ably assisted by John Skeet and Denise D'Agnone



The Lautem water project was initiated in 2005 by members of the Notre Dame Parish in Cloverdale in response to constant media reports of the ongoing suffering of the Timorese people from the lack of basic essentials such as clean water food security and sanitation. The children have very high mortality rates due to malnutrition and basic health care.

Many of the problems relate to a lack of constant onsite clean water in the villages forcing the need to travel long distances to collect and cart the water from open sources which are often contaminated by unrestricted livestock.

The Groups first job was to finish off the previous bore hole at Dara Sula.

This bore had been previously drilled to a depth of 38 metres.

The group proceeded to put down the bore casing and seal the bore hole ready for 'Seeds of Life' to install a pump system

The Group then went to Soiquili where it was found that the contaminated water supply had dried up and there was no ground water available for the water filter we had brought from Dili.

Also the hand water pump was not working

The villages had resorted to bucketing out water from the well approximately 300m up a hillside.

After a site inspection with and a suggestion from John Skeet to try syphoning the water down the hill to the village

80 metres of 25mm poly pipe was found to be the only thing left at Lautem

And by joining this to the 50 metres of 19mm poly pipe on the submersible pump, the pipe was primed and it was proved that the syphoning system would work

The group then made a quick trip to Dili for a roll of 20mm x 250 metres of poly pipe and fittings to make a tap at the end of the poly pipe within 50 metres of the Primary School.

After returning to Soiquili and installing the new poly pipe into the well and fitting the new tap to the pipe line.

The water was then turned on to the great delight of the villagers

Tom Hoyer returned to Soiquili and carried out repairs to the hand pump with the kit that had to be purchased in Dili.

When we left the villagers had tap water and a working hand pump.

The water filter was installed in the health clinic at Lautem where they had been boiling drinking water and water used for cleaning wounds

Whist John Janet and Max went to Dili to buy supplies for Soiquili

Ern and Tom returned to Larga to commence drilling a bore

Max, Janet and John stopped on the way to assist in setting up the drill rig.

This bore was required as the existing pipe lines had been cut leaving 150 orphans and 400 school kids without water

Thus requiring a 2km walk in each direction to get water from an existing well

After two false starts the first struck solid rock at 1.5 metres and the second at 2.5 metres

After relocating to a complete new site we proceeded to drill to a depth of approximately 10 metres

Water was struck at around 9 metres

However we need to return and sink the bore a further 3 to 5 metres to ensure sufficient water supply for the orphanage

Janet spent several days here teaching English and classical ballet to the orphans and was very well received

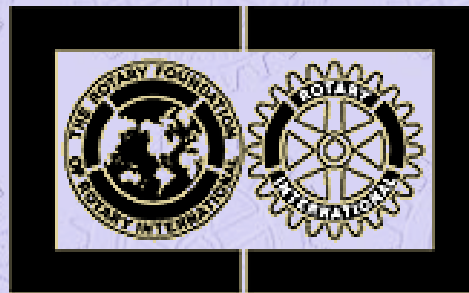
