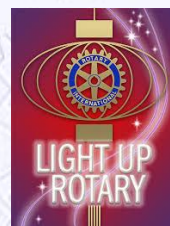

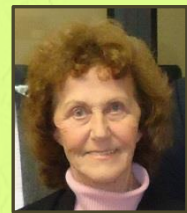
Lorraine had two young people attend RYPEN. We have received certificates and our participants will be invited along to a meeting to receive them.

## Call for signatures to request formal poll on amalgamation

05/Nov/2014

The Kwinana community can now officially request a poll on the proposed amalgamation of Kwinana and Cockburn, which, if successful, would trigger a formal vote on whether it proceeds at all.

The Local Government Advisory Board (LGAB) commenced its statutory advertising period today and Kwinana electors have until 5 December to collect at least 250 valid signatures in order to request a Poll.

The City of Kwinana is facilitating the process to make it easier for community members, however to allow enough time to collate all information, we ask that all forms and signatures are provided by Friday 28 November 2014.

Individual electors can visit either the City's Administration Office or the Kwinana Public Library and sign the official form. From these locations they can also take away additional forms and collect signatures of their own, but these should be returned to the City for processing.

The government announced its plans for council reform last month, and has since confirmed it would provide only a pittance of the full costs required to undertake the process, forcing the community to pay many millions of dollars to cover the reform costs.

Mayor Adams believes there will be many in the community who will passionately oppose the Kwinana Cockburn amalgamation.

"Council certainly encourages the Kwinana community to think seriously about their future and whether they would like to exercise their right to a poll," she said.

"Kwinana electors are fortunate, more so than most in Perth, to have retained this basic democratic right so it is important not to throw that right away."

### Right to request a Poll

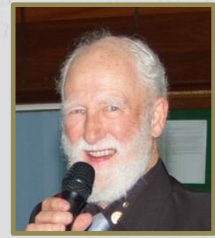
The LGAB is legally required to notify affected communities of their right to a poll and must allow at least one month for residents to secure the 250 signatures required to trigger one. If a poll is requested, it will be undertaken by the Western Australian Electoral Commission via a postal vote, similar to a normal local government election.

**Latest information is City of Kwinana now has more than the required number of signatures, Council now needs to move forward.**

Markets: Chris and Genevieve were looking after the toilets, no one told them we had packed up and were going home.

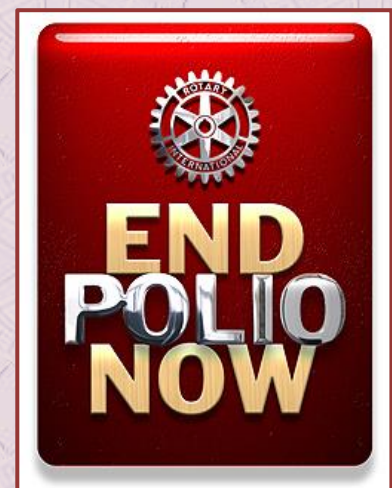
Ian and Greg attended a Navy reunion, and were model citizens and couldn't be fined for anything. (according to Ian )

### Polio this week as of 4 November 2014

Two new cases of circulating vaccine derived polio virus (cVDPV) have been reported in South Sudan, constituting an outbreak.

Immunization activities are planned in November and December in order to stop the spread of cVDPV.

- Immunization campaigns in Iraq in September reached 88% of children under 5. Around 20 million children were vaccinated across the Middle East in October. These activities are helping to protect the gains made against the virus in the region, with no case reported for nearly 7 months.
- In central Africa, it has been 6 months since the latest case of polio in Equatorial Guinea. In Cameroon, high level delegates from the World Health Organization, UNICEF and the Center for Disease Control and Prevention met with the Prime Minister and the Minister of Health in order to discuss the urgency of the outbreak response.



In the **98 days** since the first of the **888,246** ceramic poppies was planted at the Tower of London, the installation has become a focal point of Britain's remembrance events in this, the 100th anniversary year of the start of the **First World War**.

The installation, named **Blood Swept Lands and Seas of Red**, consists of one poppy for each British and colonial life lost during the conflict.



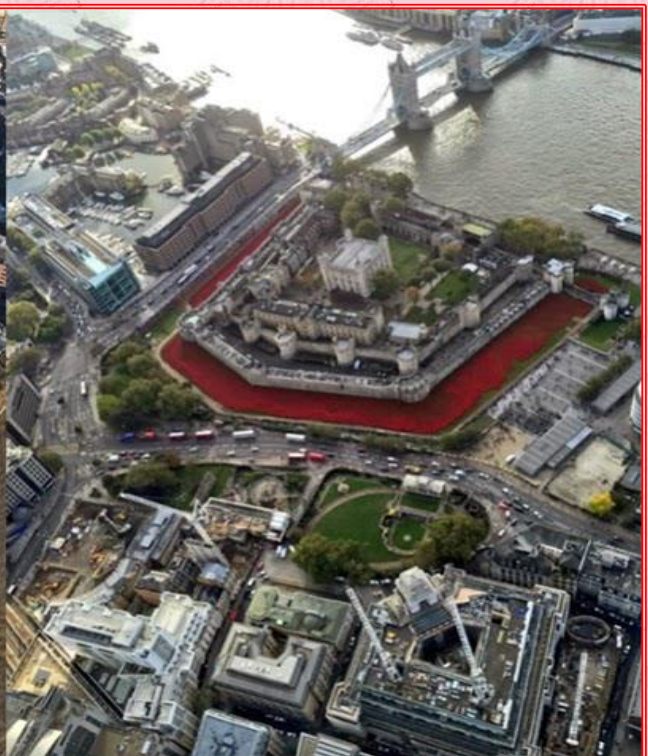
It was created by the ceramic artist Paul Cummins and stage designer Tom Piper.

An estimated four million people are believed to have visited the display and floodlights were kept on during the nights leading up to Armistice Day to allow more visitors to see the installation.

The poppies were sold for £25 each, raising £15,000,000 for various military charities.

The poppies were hand made by 50 volunteers at Paul Cummins Ceramics, Derby UK

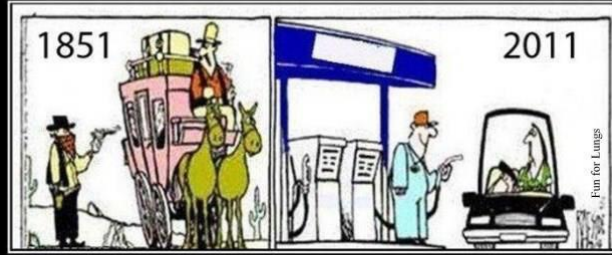

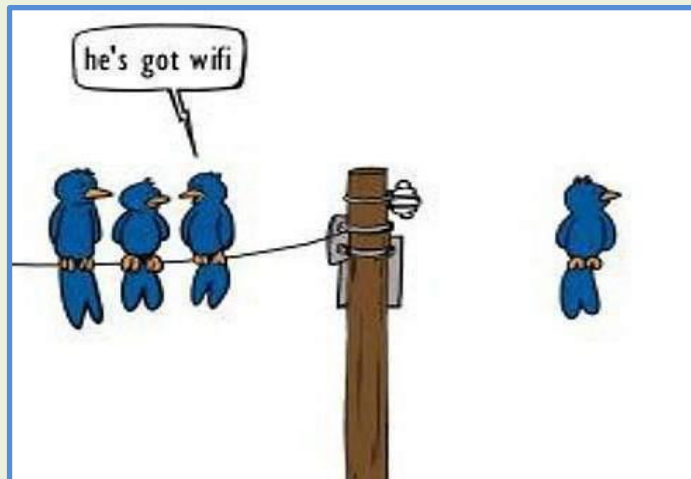
