Guest speakers tonight are Michelle and Khalen Young from Karlup Wheels in Motion.

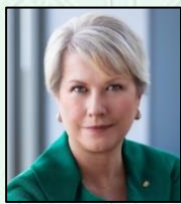

Karlup Wheels in Motion.



Our event is Wheels In Motion For Camaraderie.

My husband Khalen Young and myself Michelle Young started our organisation to assist less fortunate youth join in physical activities throughout WA.

Khalen has 33years experience within BMX and other cycling disciplines, I have experience working and volunteering with indigenous, non-indigenous youth and the community.

Karlup Wheels In Motion Indigenous Corporation supports all youth but is an indigenous owned corporation.

My husband is an avid Indigenous cyclist who represented Australia at the 2012 London Olympics and other events around the world.

Karlup has been registered with ORIC and the ACNC since October 2022.

Khalen is a Director; I am the Secretary. We also have directors and volunteers who are indigenous and non-indigenous.

KWIMIC supports cohesion amongst youth by using sporting activities to bring them together regardless of race, gender, socioeconomic status, or physical capabilities. Wheels In Motion For Camaraderie will promote the importance of sport and recreation as an alternative to antisocial behaviour. The volunteers and mentors range from community members to elite Australian sportsman and a former Indigenous Olympian who will be encouraging and inspiring the youth on the day. All youth who attend and their families will feel cohesion through the carefully thought of entertainment, family friendly, drug and alcohol-free day. Youth and the community will see this event and others to follow as something to look forward to, where they are encouraged to work together in a blended, safe environment. Its proven physical activities encourage mental fitness, this event will be a place where no one is left behind and everyone belongs.

We can't change the past, but we can help shape the future

Khalen Young (born 20 November 1984) is an Australian racing cyclist who represents Australia in BMX. He competed at the 2012 Summer Olympics in the men's BMX event, reaching the semi-final.

Khalen grew up in Kalgoorlie and then Perth in Western Australia and followed his elder brothers into riding BMX bikes. He is Indigenous and the second youngest of six children. His grandmother's family was part of the Aboriginal "stolen generation". He had great success in junior competitions, before making the senior Australian team and competing in the Brazil World Championships in 2002. In 2004 he quit the sport, deciding to compete again only when BMX was entered into the 2008 Olympic games in 2007.

He moved to California to compete professionally, winning many US competitions.

In 2007 he won the opening round of the World Cup Supercross, and the Australian National championships. At the 2007 World Championships in Victoria, Canada, he won silver. In 2007 he won the UCI BMX Supercross World Cup in Madrid.

Polio this week

30th November 2022

In Indonesia, following confirmation last week of VDPV2 isolated from an AFP case (7-year old child) with onset of paralysis on 9 October, from Aceh province, circulating of this strain has been confirmed following isolation of the virus from three healthy community contacts. See 'Indonesia' section below, for more.

At a WHO Member State Information Session on 16th November, regional and programme representatives set out the [actions being taken in 2023](#) to step up polio transition efforts towards strengthening health systems, bolstering immunization and disease surveillance, and protecting against polio outbreaks. Particular focus is on the development of a global vision for polio transition, supported by tailored regional action plans and a strengthened monitoring and evaluation framework, building on successes and lessons learned so far.

nOPV2 rollout: Approximately 525 million doses of nOPV2 have been administered across 25 countries under its WHO Emergency Use Listing (EUL). An additional 15 countries have met the requirements for nOPV2 use in the event of an outbreak. For more information on nOPV2, visit: www.polioeradication.org/nOPV2.

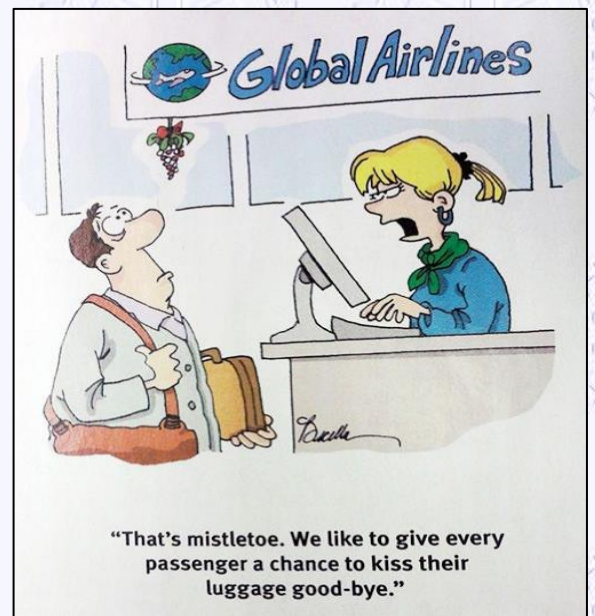
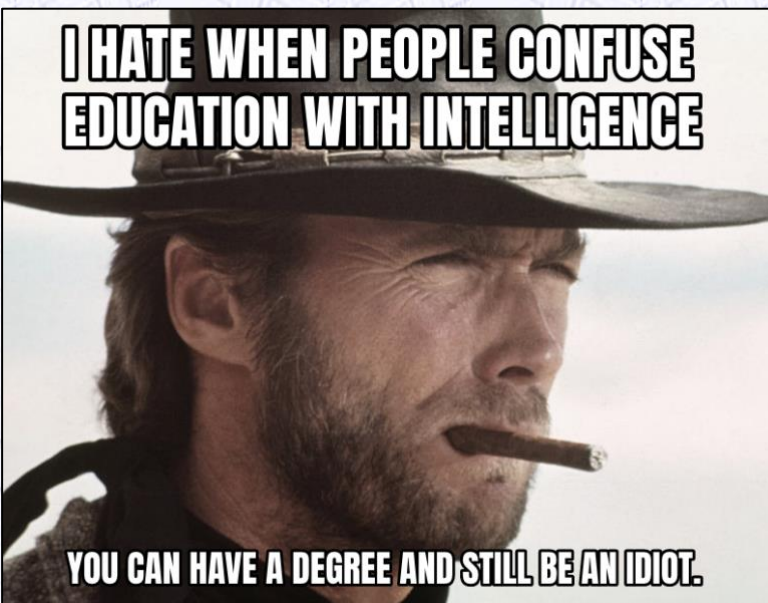
