- PP Genevieve: we didn't win the \$100ml, but paid out on the Melbourne Cup Sweep we held last week, the winner was PDG John Iriks.



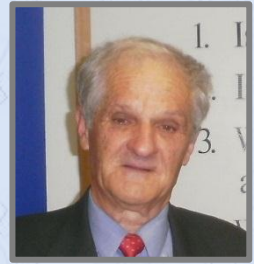
Fine Session: Sergeant Garry Bassett,

Guest Speaker: PDG Terry Barritt



District 9470 Past Governor Terry Barritt, of the Rotary Club of Armadale, W.A. has given great service through Rotary to The Rotary Foundation. He became a Service Above Self awardee at the Tri West Australian Districts Centennial Conference when the award was presented by R.I. Past Director Grattan O'Connell of New Zealand. He became a Rotarian with Armadale in 1973, President in 1983-84 and served as District 9470 governor in 1988-89.

PDG Terry served as The Rotary Foundation regional coordinator in 1999-2001 for Zones 7 and 8. These Zones at the time covered the 23 Australian and six New Zealand Rotary Districts. This appointment was a full-time commitment for Rotary for the two-year term.

He served on the Australian Rotary Foundation Trust from 1999 to 2002. He will serve on the Humanitarian Grants Cadre Committee until 2006, completing a term which began in 2003. PDG Terry has been involved in numerous The Rotary Foundation programs, the most notable being a 3H-Grant of \$US500,000 in the Philippines and securing significant funding for the Rotary Peace Centres.

Terry and wife Joan, live at Roleystone, W.A. At Katanning they operate a 5000-acre wheat and sheep farm in partnership with their son Douglas, wife Carol and their family of three sons. His daughter Fiona also lives at Roleystone with husband Laurie. They have three daughters and a son.

ARALUEN Botanic Park may be a fair distance from Buckingham Palace, but the Queen has recognised work done there as part of her birthday honours list.

Roleystone man Terry Barritt has been awarded a Medal of the Order of Australia for his service to the community through Rotary International.

Mr. Barritt has been involved in Rotary since 1973 in a number of different roles, which have taken him to different parts of the world. One of the biggest local projects he managed was the reconstruction of the World War I Memorial at Araluen Botanic Park.

The memorial was created in the 1930s as a memorial to those who died in the war, but by 1994, it was almost in a state of disrepair. "Everything was slipping down the hill," Mr. Barritt said.

He helped secure funding for the project and for training of previously long-term unemployed people from the area who worked on the restoration of the memorial.

Mr. Barritt said his work with Rotary gave him a great sense of satisfaction and he said it was thanks to the support of his family, especially his wife Joan, that had allowed him to contribute so much to local and international communities.



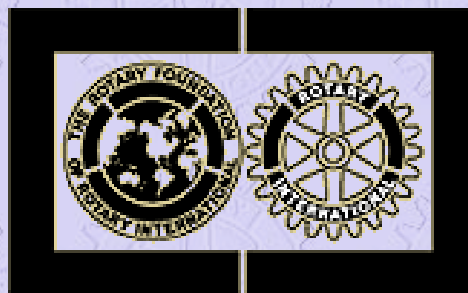
District 9470 supported R.I. President Glen Kinross in 1997-98 by providing more than 100 shelters for his Low Cost Shelters initiative.

In 1998-99 the Rotary Club of Armadale received a \$US475,000 3-H Grant from The Rotary Foundation to build dams in the Philippines.

District 9470 Past Governor Terry Barritt from Armadale was the first West Australian to be appointed as a Rotary Regional Foundation coordinator.

Making the world a better place

Rotary Foundation grants support Rotarian efforts to change lives and serve communities through projects that promote peace, fight disease, provide clean water, save mothers and children, support education, and grow local economies.

Rotary Foundation grants

Rotary's new grant model, often called the Future Vision Plan, is both simplified and streamlined, reducing the number of Foundation grant types from 12 to three.

The new model goes into effect on 1 July 2013.
