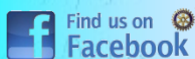

The Rotary National Insurance Program offers one of the most comprehensive levels and types of insurance coverage available to Australian Community and Not-for-Profit organisations. The key focus of this insurance is to provide insurance coverage for all of Rotary's activities, insurable legal liabilities, and entities.

It is hereby declared and agreed that an Insured Rotary Body is defined as:-•An entity whose activities, charitable direction and finance are in the majority controlled by, or affiliated with, an Australian Rotary Club or District or Institute or Rotary International.

An entity that agrees to implement and follow the risk management, general management, and guidelines as recommended by Rotary Australia and Rotary International; An Australian Rotary Club or District or Institute or Rotary International confirms in writing to the entity and the Rotary Australia National Insurance committee that the entity complies with the above definition and the entity is recognised as a Rotary entity.

Honorary Membership

“Honorary” is one of the two types of membership a person may have in a Rotary club. This type of membership is the highest distinction a Rotary club can confer and is exercised only in exceptional cases to recognize an individual for unusual service and contributions to Rotary and society. Honorary members cannot propose new members to the club, do not hold office and are exempt from attendance requirements and club dues.

Many distinguished heads of state, explorers, authors, musicians, astronauts and other public personalities have been honorary members of Rotary clubs, including King Gustaf of Sweden, King George VI of England, King Badouin of Belgium, King Hassan III of Morocco, Sir Winston Churchill, humanitarian Albert Schweitzer, Charles Lindbergh, composer Jean Sibelius, explorer Sir Edmund Hillary, Thor Heyerdahl, Thomas Edison, Walt Disney, Bob Hope, Dr. Albert Sabin, British Prime Minister Margaret Thatcher and many of the presidents of the United States. Truly, those selected for honorary membership are those who have done much to further the ideals of Rotary.

In a year marked by the global COVID-19 pandemic, global health leaders convening virtually at this week's World Health Assembly called for continued urgent action on polio eradication.

The Assembly congratulated the African region on reaching the public health milestone of certification as wild polio free, but highlighted the importance of global solidarity to achieve the goal of global eradication and certification.

Last week, WHO and UNICEF launched an emergency call to action for measles and polio outbreak response, to protect children by vaccination.

It is a global call to action, both for countries to re-boost their immunization systems in the wake of COVID-19 and for the international community to work together to ensure that the financial resources needed on an emergency basis are rapidly made available.

13 November is the deadline for prospective bidders to submit their applications for the Consultancy to provide technical support to the GACVS (Global Advisory Committee on Vaccine Safety) Sub-Committee for nOPV2. More information on the Request for Proposals.
