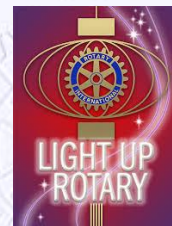

City of Kwinana Council has acquired enough signatures (250+) to invoke a community pole under the Dadour Provisions, which if won would stop the amalgamation process for now at least. If I understand the process. With some 17,000 eligible voters, 8500+ must cast a vote, with 50%+ of those casting a 'No vote'. With this being such an emotive issue together with the promise of an aggressive campaign for the 'No Vote' one would envisage/hope that the required numbers will be achieved. The important thing always will be that the people of Kwinana are given the democratic right to either accept or reject the proposed amalgamation.

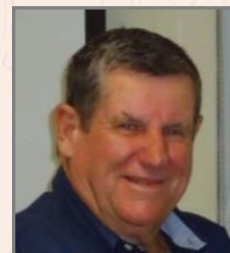

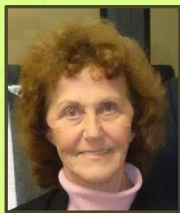
Lorraine had two young people attend RYPEN. We have received certificates and our participants will be invited along to a meeting to receive them.

Malala Yousafzai wins the 2014 Nobel Peace Prize

Malala Yousafzai, the Pakistani teenager shot in the head for speaking out against the Taliban in support of girls' education, has been awarded the Nobel Peace Prize for 2014.

Yousafzai, whose father is a Rotarian, shares the prize with Kailash Satyarthi, a native of India who has worked to combat the exploitation of children for financial gain, according to an announcement in October from the Norwegian Nobel Committee.

In announcing the award, the committee praised Yousafzai for demonstrating that "children and young people, too, can contribute to improving their own situations." It noted that "through her heroic struggle she has become a leading spokesperson for girls' rights to education."

Yousafzai was a voracious reader and a star student at the Khushal School and College in Swat Valley when she began blogging, at the age of 15, about life in the valley and her opposition to a Taliban edict banning girls from attending school. Although she used a pseudonym, her identity was widely known, especially after she began granting TV interviews.

In October 2012, she was going home from school when a gunman barged onto her bus and shot her point-blank in the head. She was airlifted to Peshawar, where she endured a three-hour operation to remove the bullet and part of her skull. Six days later, she was flown to a hospital in Birmingham, England, that specializes in treating war casualties. Her plight became international news, and she has continued her activism since her recovery.

Yousafzai's father, Ziauddin Yousafzai, a member of the Rotary Club of Mingora Swat, has taken part in a number of the club's projects to improve the Swat Valley.

He was instrumental in creating a nonprofit group called the Swat Relief Initiative, which purchased new equipment for a local hospital, built a water filtration plant, and established a mobile prosthesis clinic for people who had lost limbs to bombs.

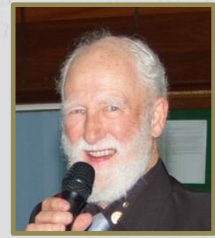
Now in Birmingham, he serves as an adviser to former UK Prime Minister Gordon Brown, a UN special envoy for global education.

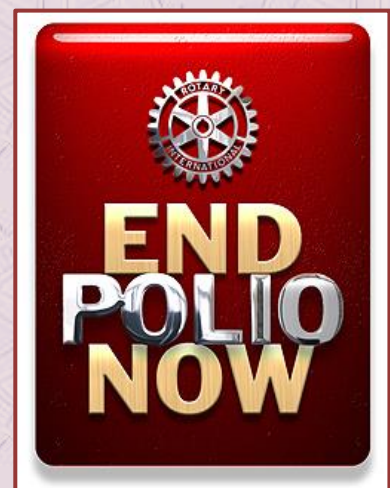

Polio this week as of 13 November 2014

This week, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), USA, released a report marking 2 years during which type 3 wild poliovirus has not been detected anywhere in the world. While the CDC report concludes that WPV3 transmission has possibly been interrupted, continued sensitive surveillance is needed before a final conclusion on WPV3 eradication can be made. –
