

- Report of the Timor-Leste August/Sept 2014 project has been sent off to Foundation, and is awaiting final Authorisations
- 24th November Meeting with Graham Hunter, Brian Eddy, and Roger Cook on surplus school computers that are available for schools within Timor-Leste, we decided to gain other clubs support and, trial a pilot program of 750 computers, the team will need volunteers to clean the computers and reinstall the original software programs. Computer pilot program will likely cost about AUD\$69,629.00, spread over a 3 to 6 month
- 27th November was the guest Speaker at the Margret River Lions Club.
- 9th December I will also be guest Speaker at Ballajura -Malaga Rotary Club
- I have also been asked to be Guest speaker at Mill Point in the early New Year.
- Invitations have been sent to all the other clubs that have supported Timor-Leste programs and advising them that I' am prepared to visit and update the clubs on the projects progress.
- Budgets the next lot of Water & Sanitations projects within Timor-Leste are now complete AUD\$62,886.00




The next Wellard Village Markets will be next held on Sunday 14th December, great opportunity to play some Christmas music.



Polio this week as of 01 December 2014

- ☐ In response to the outbreak of circulating vaccinederived poliovirus (cVDPV) in South Sudan, over 19,000 children were vaccinated last week in Bentiu Poc, where the two cases were reported. Outbreak response plans are in place to hold three rounds of supplementary immunization activities (SIAs) in high risk areas to stop transmission of the virus.
- ☐ In the north of Madagascar, SIAs are planned for December in response to the outbreak of cVDPV. National Immunization Days are planned for January. The aim is to boost immunity across the country against all strains of poliovirus.
- □ A planning meeting was held in Pakistan last week to develop a strategy for the low poliovirus transmission season, December 2014 to May 2015, using lessons learned from high risk areas. There is national consensus for the low season plan, including increased support from the Pakistan law enforcement and security services. The structure of the planned Emergency Operations Centre for polio eradication at the Federal and Provincial levels is being finalized.
- ☐ For the first time ever, only 1 case of wild poliovirus has been reported in Africa in the last 4 months, despite the high season for polio transmission. The most recent case had onset of paralysis on 11 August in Somalia








