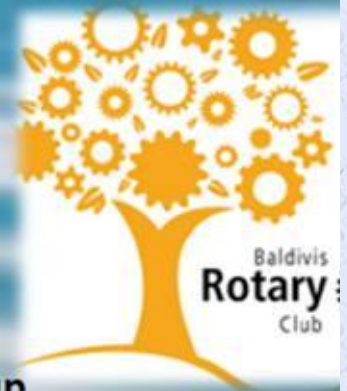

Guest Speaker

Tiffany Lewis – National Youth Science Forum

This week's guest speaker was Tiffany Lewis, who recently attended the National Youth Science Forum (NYSF) at the University of Queensland in Brisbane.

The NYSF is an annual event which was established by Rotary 35 years ago. The program is open to Year 11 students who are studying science at school, and aims to introduce them to the many aspects and potential career options associated with science. The program content includes visiting science labs, site visits, and undertaking of specific tasks and activities. Since establishment, the NYSF has been held at the Australian National University in Canberra. However, in 2018 the decision was made to hold an additional NYSF in Brisbane.

The 2018 NYSF program in Brisbane was as follows:

- Day 1: Lab visit to ARC Quantum
- Day 2: Mechanics lab followed by Rotary and Alumni night with many guest speakers
- Day 3: Autonomous Robot Rescue
- Day 4: "Think Big & Beyond" followed by science casting disco where they starred as zombies
- Day 5: Home Hospitality, which allowed them time to sleep and relax
- Day 6: Lecture by host of SCOPE
- Day 7: Tour of Port of Brisbane, and visit to centre of Quantum Dynamics at Griffith University where they discussed and looked at models of CERN, the hydro collider in Europe
- Day 8: Robot called Mako that performs surgery on knees
- Day 9: Speed dating (but not that kind!) where questions are posed and answered; NYSF dinner
- Day 10: Tour of Brisbane City Hall
- Day 11: Flew home

In all, 200 students attended NYSF in Brisbane, whilst 400 students attended NYSF in Canberra. Of the total, 50 students were from WA.

The National Youth Science Forum (NYSF) is a not-for-profit organisation that runs a number of residential programs to encourage young people in their passion for science. Our programs show the wide variety of engaging, rewarding and inspiring study and career options available in science, technology and engineering fields.

Our flagship program is the NYSF Year 12 Program, which runs in January each year for students about to enter year 12. Since 1984, more than 11,500 young Australians have progressed through the NYSF Year 12 Program (including those run under the organisation's previous banner, the National Science Summer School (NSSS)).

Rotary is the Founding Partner of NYSF and today the 21 local Rotary districts across Australia continue to conduct selections for the NYSF Year 12 Program on behalf of the NYSF.

Further programs delivered by the NYSF include

- [NYSF Next Step Program](#) – for current NYSF Year 12 Program participants;
- [NYSF International Program](#) – for current NYSF Year 12 Program participants;
- [STEM Explorer Program](#) – a week long residential program targeting year 7-8 students;
- [NYSF National Science Teachers Summer School \(NSTSS\)](#) – a residential program designed to continue inspiring high school science teachers;
- [Student Staff Leadership Program \(SSLP\)](#) – for selected NYSF Year 12 Program participants - training our future NYSF student staff.

OUR HISTORY

The National Youth Science Forum was established in 1983, initially as the National Science Summer School (NSSS) Inc. Its aim was to encourage high school science students to come to Canberra to study. The first program was delivered in 1984 to 200 young people from across Australia. Developed under the auspices of local Rotarians and academics, the program was initially funded by the Canberra Development Commission.

Over the years, NYSF has evolved and grown and is now a non-profit organisation with a highly skilled, independent, volunteer board. With the support of Rotary clubs across Australia, students in year 11 apply to attend the NYSF Year 12 Program. If appropriate, students are then endorsed for selection at Rotary district panels.
