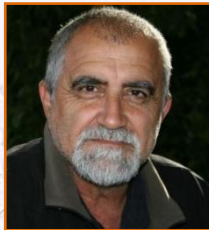

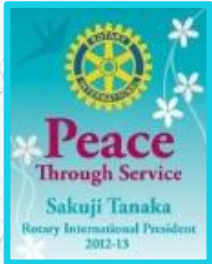

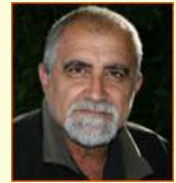

General Business

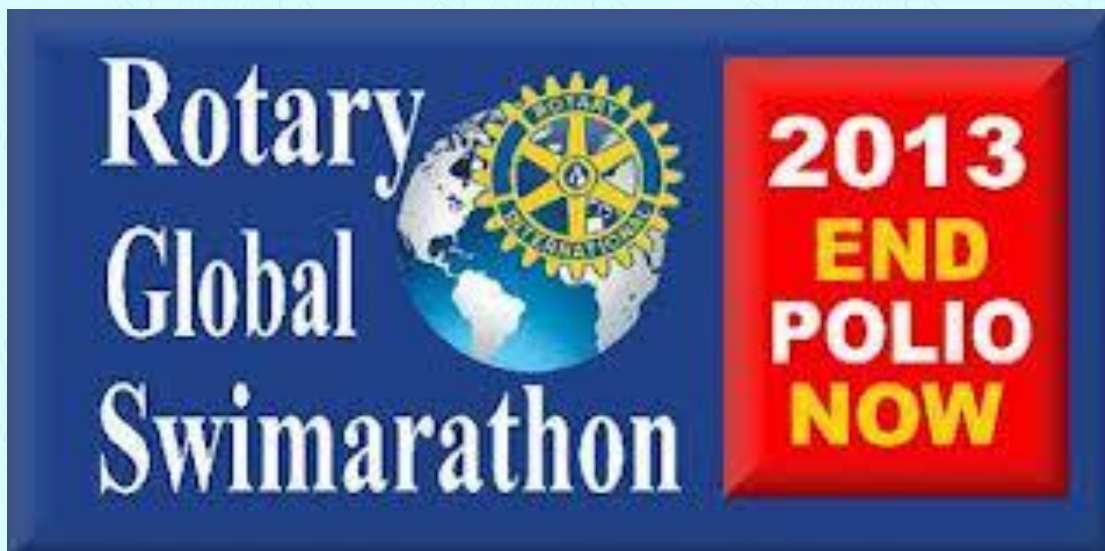
