



Polio This Week: 04th February 2019

The 144th Session of the Executive Board concluded on 1 February with a renewed support from the public health leadership for a final push to end polio

The Global Surveillance Action Plan 2018-2020 is now online. The GPSAP aims to support endemic, outbreak, and high-risk countries in evaluating and increasing the sensitivity of their surveillance systems.

Summary of new viruses this week:

Afghanistan- one case of wild poliovirus type 1 (WPV1);

Pakistan – one case of WPV1 and six WPV1-positive environmental samples;

Niger –one case of circulating vaccine derived poliovirus (VDPV2).

With my humble, on behalf of Baguia community specifically who are benefit from the water supply would like to thank you for all your hard work and big support to us in Baguia during dry season. you are who knows better what community need.

You understand our life and our difficulties.

You are very supportive and give us water when there is no water.

This water supply is an extraordinary support.

You support the future of our nation.

schools and orphanage are the most needed. You also support the institutions and you rise more number of visitors at the Fort accommodation by putting water tanks and water running easily into accommodations.

You already assist the women who carry water every day for accommodation. And a lot of people from Nahae, Buibela until Larisula you helped they feel and they can see you share God's love with them. We who leave around Baguia town, Our life during dry season last year feel a little bit comfortable because we have enough water for cooking and drinking. We have time table to run the water for community. Each day two hours water running for community. I will attach some photos. Celestino was the controller.

The community are feeling very safe and enough for drinking and cooking.

I hope you will help the other community outside Baguia for water supply.

Stewart is the editor of the local newspaper The Sound Telegraph.

The company office is at 44 Hurrell Way, Rockingham, Stewart has 2 female Journalists to assist him.

Stewart grew up in the Southwest of WA when the only TV they had was the ABC and GWN.

He became interested in Journalism at an early age and got his first job in newspapers at Pinjarra. He was involved in setting up an independent publication in Pinjarra but it didn't last very long.

Stewart then moved on to Narrogin where he spent some time with the local paper.

Seven years ago Stewart moved to The West Australian and soon found himself at the Community Newspapers Group and to the Sound Telegraph in Rockingham.

He spent 2 years managing the Telegraph website before becoming editor on the Print version.

The Telegraph has its print deadline on Monday at 6pm.

The strongest stories are run on pages 1,3 and 5 with the softer ones on pages 2 and 4.

Stewart sees it as his responsibility to present every story in positive light.

There is as we all know a huge swing to on-line news as a alternative to Print. So it's not surprising that the has been a major downturn in print media revenue. The print media are slaves to advertising as without it there is no paper.

One other big worry for journalists is the Social Media and fake news, which we all know is big in the USA at present.

Sound Telegraph produces the local newspaper published on Wednesday each week and distributed free throughout Rockingham, Kwinana, Orelia, Parmelia, Calista, Medina, Leda, Bertram, Wellard, Port Kennedy, Warnbro, Waikiki, Cooloongup, Safety Bay, Shoalwater, Hillman, Baldivis, Karnup, Secret Harbour, Golden Bay and Singleton.

They are also responsible for the Southern Telegraph which is again is published on Wednesday each week and distributed free throughout Madora Bay, Lakelands, San Remo, Silversands and Meadow Springs.
