Need for more social media promotion. I think we as a club generally do this very well. Thanks to Kim's expertise and efforts.

Meetings of Community Groups to be initially held perhaps monthly to 6 weekly initially and possibly twice yearly as things progress.

We will be looking for hopefully, an experienced Rotarian to volunteer as our club representative on the Group.







Camp Opportunity is a week-long live in camp for young special-needs adult "Campers", between the ages of 18 and 35 years ", to team with "Buddies" for a week of adventure as they mix and inter-act in a fun atmosphere to share new friendships and experiences. It is held at the Point Walter Recreation Centre, Bicton which is a dormitory style camp with rooms for 4 people, each has its own bathroom and caters for people with disabilities.

Onsite activities include Archery, Abseiling, Flying Fox with trips to the Zoo, Adventure World, Ten Pin Bowling and fun on the river for biscuit and boat rides. Participants will also enjoy a Disco, Karaoke, lots of swimming in the pool, games and laughter.

Polio this week

11th March 2024

8th of March is International Women's Day and to mark the occasion, you are invited to attend a webinar about the powerful impact of women in the global effort to eradicate polio. During the webinar, women working on the frontlines in Afghanistan, the Democratic Republic of the Congo, Nigeria and Pakistan will share the experiences and challenges they face in the fight against polio. The Department of Polio Eradication of the World Health Organization (WHO) is seeking experts to serve as members of the Containment Working Group (CWG) of the Global Commission for the Certification of Eradication of Poliomyelitis (GCC). Please see here for information on how to apply.

My name is Farid, and I am 35 years old. I live in the Bati Kot district of Nangarhar province. I contracted polio when I was three years old. The symptoms started with a fever, then a weakness in my left leg and weakness in my left hand. While strength eventually returned to my hand, my leg remained weak. My parents took me to the doctor. After medical examinations, the doctors said that I had polio and there is no cure. When my parents heard that I could not be treated, they took me home. Read the rest of Farid's story here.

- Liberia: one cVDPV2-positive environmental sample
- Mali: three cVDPV2 cases
- Nigeria: eight cVDPV2 cases and seven positive environmental samples
- Somalia: three cVDPV2 cases


