



With March being Water and Sanitation Month on the Rotary calendar, PP Max Bird's Service Above Self award in recognition of his work in Timor to provide adequate drinking water to people living in villages was particularly special.





# **Guest Speaker**

This week we enjoyed an informative talk from Erina Goodwin. A nurse by profession, Erina has worked in the field of health and community development for over twenty years. Erina currently works for the organization known as **Best West**, where she is largely involved in training and assessment. Her workplace is based at a centre in Meares Ave, Kwinana.

Best West provides both training and agency work for aged care staff. Staff are sent to service a range of residential care facilities in the southern corridor of Perth. A strong emphasis is placed on ethics, and dealing with grief and loss. Best West prides itself on making an investment in every care worker so that in turn these people can provide the best quality of care to clients.

Specific training provided by Best West includes:

- Certificate III in Aged Care
  - Qualifies staff to work in aged care facilities within three months
  - Provides three weeks' training, followed by a four-week work placement
  - Covers ageing, Health and Community Care (HACC), disability (three certificates in one)
- First Aid
- One-day course on medications
  - Valuable for staff and family members looking after an aged person
- Clinical skills
  - Good for managing blood pressure, diabetes, kidney problems
- Dementia training
  - In Australia, every six minutes someone is diagnosed with dementia.
  - Training staff to assist people with dementia to maintain optimum independence.
- Dysphagia training
  - Approximately 77% of nursing home residents have a certain amount of dysphagia (swallowing difficulty)
  - Course teaches how to feed, thicken fluids, modify diets to prevent choking incidents
- Manual handling training
  - For both staff and families
- Palliative care
  - Refers to looking after people with a life-limiting condition
  - Provides training for how to assist people both physically and spiritually
- Mental Health
  - Train workers to help families and individuals
- Certificate IV in Aged Care, Disability, Mental Health
  - Training enables one to coordinate services
  - Good for people planning to eventually take up nursing as a profession
  - Completed externally
