

Polio This Week: 05th March 2019

- On 26-27 February 2019, the Global Commission for Certification of the Eradication met at the World Health Organization in Geneva to continue its work on global certification criteria for wild poliovirus eradication and containment. The GCC reviewed all the latest global epidemiology and examined remaining challenges in the interruption of wild polio virus.
- Featured on polioeradication.org: Coffee with Polio Experts— Dr Nicksy Gumede-Moeletsi, senior virologist at WHO's Regional Office for Africa, talks about how genetic analysis of isolated polioviruses is helping strategically drive eradication efforts in Africa.
- Summary of new viruses this week:
- Pakistan two WPV1-positive environmental samples;
 Nigeria— one circulating vaccine-derived poliovirus type 2 (cVDPV2) case.







Guest Speakers:

Leslie Brown & Constance Chipper. Gilmore College



Leslie and Connie are teachers in the Humanities and Social Sciences area at Gilmore College. They began their presentation by showing the Student Year 12 results.

140 Students attended year 12 at Gilmore College, largest number since the 1970's. 122 of these were eligible to achieve a WA Certificate of Education certificate. 77 of these achieved their WACE.

Vocational Education and Training.

183 students enrolled in VET in year 12 2018, the largest number at Gilmore College ever.

88 completed a Certificate II,

7 Achieved a Certificate IV (Nursing at RSHS)

45 did not submit enough coursework and assessment material to be awarded a Certificate. 100% of students enrolled in the following courses achieved their Certificate: Horticulture, Nursing, Sport and Recreation, Community Services, Hospitality and Process Plant Operations. All but one of our KIC Engineering students achieved their qualification (left school early). There were low completion rates in Business and Computing despite efforts to complete these students' studies by teaching staff.

ATAR Results.

28 students were awarded an Australian Tertiary Admissions Rank (ATAR) in 2018. This is the largest number of Tertiary Entrance (TEE) students since the 1970's. There was a certificate of Distinction and a Certificate of Merit among our graduates. There were 10 students who achieved an ATAR above 80 - (Top 20% of all Australian students and direct entry to all Australian Universities).

One student achieved an ATAR of 99.70 and has been accepted into Medicine at UWA. One student achieved an ATAR of 95.65 and has commenced Chemical Engineering at Curtin University.

Our median ATAR was 60.95 in 2018 up from 52.95 in 2017 and 33.53 in 2016. We are VERY proud of our 2018 ATAR students and all of our students for that matter.

Gilmore College's Sustainable Journey:

Gilmore College in Kwinana boosted their sustainability effort in 2017 thanks to participation in Waste Wise Schools. The school has made a concerted effort to engage both students and staff in sustainability across a range of areas. We are proud to recognise Gilmore College as a Switch on School.

Gardens.....Waste.....Social Handprint....Litter.....Transport.....Water.



Garden's:

Students constructed an upcycled vertical garden from milk bottles donated by staff. This simple action attracted the attention of local businesses that donated raised garden beds, soil, seedlings and mulch to help the College achieve its gardening goals.

Waste:

Gilmore College is serious about reducing waste.

Each classroom is equipped with a paper recycling bin and a team of dedicated students collect recycling and deposit it in the recycling skip bin each week. The design and technology department fashioned a compost bin from a wheelie bin that's now used to compost food scraps from the canteen, classrooms and student lunches.

Social Handprint:

The Sustainability Committee works hard to improve the ecological footprint as well as the social handprint of Gilmore College, including collecting:

- Ring pulls that will be melted down to make prosthetic limbs
- Stamps to raise money for kidney health
- Bottle lids to make a bead curtain from plastic bag string and
- Used spectacles for the Specsavers and Lions Recycle for Sight program. All activities are shared with families through the school newsletter and with staff through the Sustainability Committee Connect page and "Sustainability Corner" in the Principal's weekly email. Dedicated staff commit their time to sustainability at Gilmore College during and after school hours as well as on weekends and during school holidays.

Litter:

Inspired by Baldivis Senior High School, litter hotspots were identified with big red posters which, along with class rubbish runs and staff leading by example, has significantly reduced the litter problem. Students, staff and volunteers from local businesses have also reduced litter in the wider community by proudly participating in Clean up Australia Day.

Transport:

Gilmore College participated in Bike Week and rewarded students who rode or scooted to school. Students have also started on a project to upcycle donated bike wheels into giant dream catchers.

Water:

Gilmore College has recently achieved Waterwise School status and are dedicated water savers. They have fitted low flow taps and tap timers to reduce water use across the school. Water conservation is also embedded into the curriculum including Waterwise lessons on how different cultures value water.

The school has recently established an aquaponics system that combines the benefits of a hydroponics setup, but also uses the water to grow Silver Perch that can be harvested for eating. The fish provide nutrients back into the garden beds and as Silver Perch are vegetarian, it's possible to grow the food for the fish, demonstrating the nutrient cycle and an almost closed-loop, waste free system providing fresh produce and fish.
