2. YOUTH EXCHANGE PROGRAM




Pensioners fined because they are about to receive a 'pay rise'



At CBH Kwinana their grain loading jetty which was built in 1965 has massive conveyer belts to load ships at their wharf. These are moved into position by huge cable-drums. These drums have a braking mechanism in the form of a large brake-shoe which rubs onto the drum as a brake. Over time the surface of the drum had rusted and pitted so that when the brake-shoe came into contact it created a very loud squealing noise that could be heard in the Rockingham residential area.

Some 5 years ago Powerdrive were given the task of finding a remedy to fix the problem. Peter had a colleague in a neighbouring engineering business who was just the man to help. Byron devised a method to provide a portable lathe to machine the drum surfaces. A new brake-shoe was designed so it is easier to service in the future. Together, at the time they solved a particularly difficult task and were able to recondition the drums and brake shoes into working order again.


The completed drum after machining.




The portable lathe in place

Polio survivor and eradication advocate, Paul Alexander has passed away at the age of 78, after living in an iron lung for over 70 years. Paul contracted polio in 1952 when he was six and the disease left him unable to breathe independently leading to his placement in an iron lung. Despite his physical constraints, Paul obtained a law degree, wrote a memoir, and was a strong advocate for polio eradication. 
Amal Jama, a coordinator for the polio response in Sudan <u>shared an important</u> <u>message</u> about why women must share and collaborate with each other.

Sudan's Federal Ministry of Health (FMOH) will launch a polio vaccination campaign in April 2024 in response to a new emergence of variant poliovirus type 2 reported in January 2024. It was detected in six wastewater samples collected from September 2023 to January 2024 in the Port Sudan locality, Red Sea State. <u>Read more</u>...


