ACCOUNTANT John Iriks is the Kwinana Rotary Club's new president.

Mr Iriks received his chain of office from past president Ralph McKeigh at a recent change-over night at the Kwinana Motor Inn.

The new president told fellow Rotarians, Rotarionnes and guests that for the next 12 months, the club's priorities would be a membership drive for both the Rotary and Rotoractors clubs and a giant raffle to support

Kwinana community projects.

A total of 20,000 tickets would be sold at \$1 each with the first prize being \$10,000 off the winner's mortgage. If cash was preferred, this would total \$7500.

The tickets would be distributed at various business outlets throughout the town.

Guest of Honour, next year's District 946 Governor Lindsay Archer, said the good word of Rotary had been spread

many times by John Iriks.

He said it was heartening to see that Rotary was close to being reformed in Poland and that a club could be started in Russia by the close of this century.

Representing Kwinana Town Council, Deputy Mayor Dave Nelson said

being a guest at such a function made him proud to be a member of the Town of Kwinana.

"I am already involved in a Rotary project with Bridging the Gap," he said.

And with some light-hearted banter, he confessed to being jealous

that the Gap had not been started by his own club — the Lions.

He said all service clubs worked hard and did not get many pats on the back.

"But without service organisations such as Rotary, we would not have the benefits which we see around us today."

Mr. Smith warned residents that council was not bound to follow the motions' directives and would continue to make its own decisions.

Residents want council to:

- Request that the Soil Conservation Commission prepare a Coastal Management Plan of the Warnbro dunes similar to those prepared by the Town of Coleshoe and shores of Wanneroo and Corrow.
- Defer any further decisions on, and the progress of, the Hooker Rex proposal until the results of the Coastal Management Plan have been considered.
- Together with the State Government, reject any development on the Warnbro dunes on the grounds that it contravenes the State Planning Commission's Coastal Planning Policies.
- Request the State Government to acquire the dunes and declare that land a National Park.
- Request the Soil Conservation Commission to plant vegetation on the dunes a soil conservation district.
- Request the State Government to fund community first aid stations for the

Polio This Week: 27^h March 2019

□ Dr Tedros Adhanom Ghebreyesus, WHO Director-General and Chair of the Polio Oversight Board, has issued a personal response to the extraordinary joint statement published in January by the Chairs of the main, independent, advisory and oversight committees of the GPEI.

The joint statement is an impassioned plea by the Chairs of the Strategic Advisory Group of Experts on immunization (SAGE), the Independent Monitoring Board, the Emergency Committee of the International Health Regulations (IHR) Regarding International Spread of Poliovirus and the Global Commission for the Certification of the Eradication of Poliomyelitis (GCC) – the Chairs urged everyone involved in the GPEI to ensure polio will finally be assigned to the history books by 2023.

□ On 27 March 2019, the WHO's Southeast Asia Region marked five years since being declared wild polio-free, with the last case in the Region detected in India on 13 January 2011. The five-year anniversary of SEARO certification celebrated success in India and across countries of the region, showcasing how countries have used the skills, knowledge and infrastructure built up by the polio programme after eradication and highlight lessons learned from the Region that are now being applied in other parts of the world.

□ Summary of new viruses this week:

Pakistan – two wild poliovirus type 1 (WPV-1) cases and 15 WPV1-positive environmental samples;

Nigeria— two circulating vaccine-derived poliovirus type 2 (cVDPV2) cases, one cVDPV2-positive environmental



The spaghetti-tree hoax

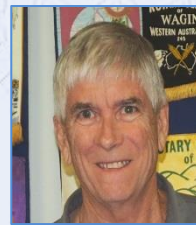
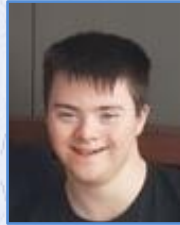
Was a three-minute hoax report broadcast on April Fools' Day 1957 by the BBC current-affairs programme *Panorama*, purportedly showing a family in southern Switzerland harvesting spaghetti from the family "spaghetti tree".

At the time spaghetti was relatively little known in the UK, so many Britons were unaware that it is made from wheat flour and water, a number of viewers afterwards contacted the BBC for advice on growing their own spaghetti trees. Decades later CNN called this broadcast "the biggest hoax that any reputable news establishment ever pulled"

Some things Brent doesn't like to do are: finds it difficult to understand 'Time' does not like to be 'Rushed' doesn't like salads, balloons and large crowds.

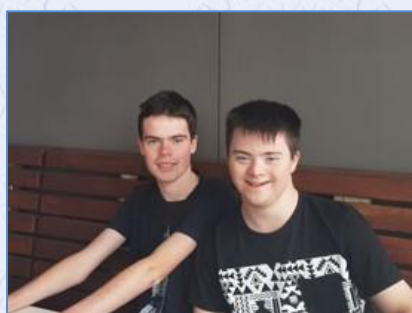
