For myself the day brought back special memories of attending Anzac Day Dawn service at the French town of Villers-Bretonneux during my travels in Europe last year. Following the service we visited the Somme battlegrounds, where we were struck by the eeriness of the surroundings. It was almost as if we could sense the bloodshed and ghosts of fallen diggers. Another memorable feature was the fact that to this day the French people feel a very deep gratitude to Australia for their efforts and sacrifices during World War I. The sight of the famous Champs-Elysees being lined with both the French flag and the Australian flag in the lead-up to Anzac Day was most heart-warming. It was certainly a good time to visit France.

Ian H.S. Riseley is a chartered accountant and principal of Ian Riseley and Co., a firm he established in 1976. Prior to starting his own firm, he worked in the audit and management consulting divisions of large accounting firms and corporations.

Riseley has been a member of the boards of both a private and a public school, a member of the Community Advisory Group for the City of Sandringham, and president of Beaumaris Sea Scouts Group. He has been president of Langi-Taan Ski Club as well as honorary auditor or adviser for a number of charitable organizations.

Riseley's honors include the AusAID Peacebuilder Award from the Australian government in recognition of his work in East Timor, the Medal of the Order of Australia for services to the Australian community, and the Regional Service Award for a Polio-Free World from The Rotary Foundation.

A Rotarian since 1978, Riseley has served as treasurer, director, Foundation trustee, and member and chair of numerous RI and Foundation committees.

He and his wife, Juliet, a past district governor, are Major Donors and Bequest Society members of The Rotary Foundation. They live on seven hectares at Moorooduc, where they practice their personal philosophy of sustainable and organic living. They have two children and four grandchildren.







Guest Speaker Max Bird

At short notice our very own President Max Bird acted as guest speaker, giving a presentation about a work project he had undertaken during 2007 – 2008 whilst working in railway construction. The project was titled **FMG Track and Bridge Alliance Project**, and involved the laying of railway track in the North-West.

"Bridge Team Success"

Pre-Christmas Position:

- All eight bridges successfully completed
- Held up by formation
- Tracklaying 15km 95km

Implementation

- Work all critical rail activities through Christmas break
- Night and day flashbutt welding
- 5 flashbutt welders on the job
- Manual tracking crews
 - North 20km to -4km loop
 - South 234.350km to Clond Breakmine at 256km

The Great Challenge

- Mine to port by end of March.
- Tracklaying using automated SUM tracklayer
- 20km to 134km completed in five months since October 2007
- 74km to complete in just over four weeks
- Noted that concrete sleepers were used, at size of 68kg/metre
- Manual track laying progressing north, south and central: 34km to complete in four weeks.

Implementation Plan – Immediate

- FBW welding 24 hours on all fronts
- Rail trolley train
- 50 extra workers
- Additional material wagons mobilised and fitted out by mid-March
- Duplication of SUM crew and material loading crew for 24-hour coverage

"The Great Comeback"

Achievements of the Team:

- Second train and double shifting of crews in place by 16 March 2008
- Worked through Easter
- Deferred rest and relaxation
- Wet weather and cyclone threats
- Delays due to wet formation
- Around the clock working
- Mechanical challenges overcome by dedicated team

"Mission Accomplished" – 8 April 2008


- Manual laying complete at port; unloading loop on 5 April
- Firt train arrived to unload at port on 6 April.
- SUM tracklaying linked into manual tracklaying 234.350km on 8 April
- Train now running from mine to port
- 102km in 38 days; five of those days weather affected
- Had a very satisfied client!
- Some generous bonuses for certain workers.
