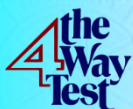

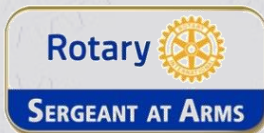

Afghanistan—one wild poliovirus type 1 (WPV1) case;

Pakistan—two WPV1 cases and 11 WPV1-positive environmental samples;

Nigeria—one cVDPV2-positive environmental sample.
