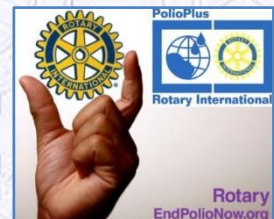

# Guest Speaker

## Eden Knight – Community Liaison Officer

Guest speaker for this evening was Eden Knight, who currently works as a community liaison officer with the City of Kwinana. Eden has had 19 years' experience in community service, working in areas such as homelessness and mental health.

The Community Liaison Service (CLO) was derived from feedback from the local community stating a need to feel safer, particularly in the CBD area of Kwinana. The survey was the bi-annual wellbeing safety survey.

The CLO team was introduced within the community in October 2017 as a pilot project to try and meet some of the needs expressed by Kwinana residents. The team includes four liaison officers, of which two are Indigenous liaison officers, who patrol the front lines of the CBD area public spaces and buildings.

Liaison differs from security in that they aim to have a proactive approach, as well as providing information, feedback and referrals rather than enforcement.

Community liaison officers aim to:

- Provide a customer service approach to the public, referring to existing services and delivering information
- Engage and build a rapport with those most in need in the community. Examples can be youth at risk; people experiencing homelessness; family and domestic violence; those affected by drugs and/or alcohol.
- Report any antisocial behavior and provide a presence at identified hotspots in the area.
- Engage with businesses and staff to ascertain their needs e.g. more CCTV requests and ranger patrols. This information is brought back to the COK management.
- Be present at City of Kwinana events and networking opportunities
- Expand to areas such as Bertram, Wellard and Medina.

The CLO team can refer people back to youth services and community engagement services. The CLO team do not case manage people, but can engage frequently with the same people who access the CBD and its services.

Some examples of our service provision:

- Young people under 12 were causing issues at the skate park, mainly damage and conflict with older youth and adults. The particular young people were referred to the CET, who visited the family on a couple of occasions to work through the issues. These particular young people have changed in their attitude and actions, and continue to engage with the liaison officers.
- Several young people experiencing homelessness have been provided with personal care packs, and referred to crisis or temporary accommodation, where they work with an accommodation support worker.
- CLO team have build a rapport with some youth that were showing signs of antisocial behavior, and have referred them to youth services of have even minimized such behavior by constant communication and relationship building.
