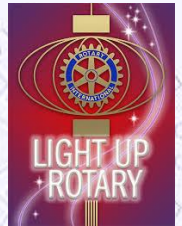

discussions continue with the shopping centre owners.

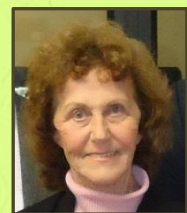

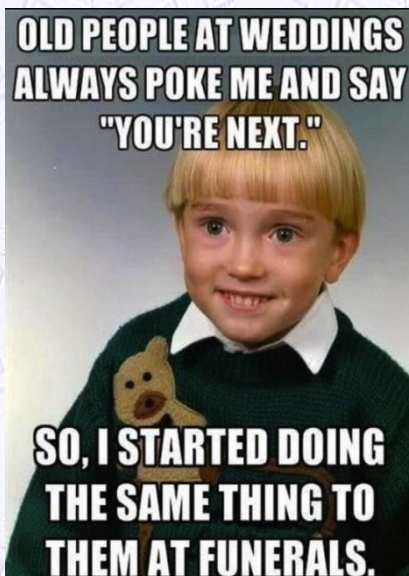

Lee Davis, originally from Melbourne came to WA in 1969, spent a little time in Perth before moving to Kalgoorlie. From there travelled to Kambalda where she stayed 5 years.

In 1974 Lee ran the Williams Roadhouse for about a year.

Lee found herself back in Kalgoorlie in 1993 where she worked with the Aboriginal Community teaching women bookkeeping and money skills.

Lee helped set up a Glass Factory making glass windows and doors etc. She went on to become the only woman manager for Pilkington Glass.

Moved back to Perth for a period then it was back up North again to Brockman Iron Ore Mine in the Pilbara, about 60 klm north-west of Tom Price. Lee made many trips exploring the area around Wittenoom.

After returning to Perth she again headed back to the North-West this time to Turkey Creek, which was now known as Warmun by the aboriginal community.

After moving to Darwin for 6 months during the wet season Lee decided that was not the place to be and headed for Tennant Creek where she worked at 3 remote stations over a three year period. Back to Tennant Creek where Lee stayed for the next 20 years. Lee enjoyed living there, she was a member of the CWA and was working with the Aboriginal Community, helped set up a Medical Clinic then an Eye Clinic for the Fred Hollows Foundation. Lee even bought a small property in the area.

Lee recently moved back to Perth, bought a home in Orelia, joined our Rotary Club and we are very fortunate to have Lee on board.

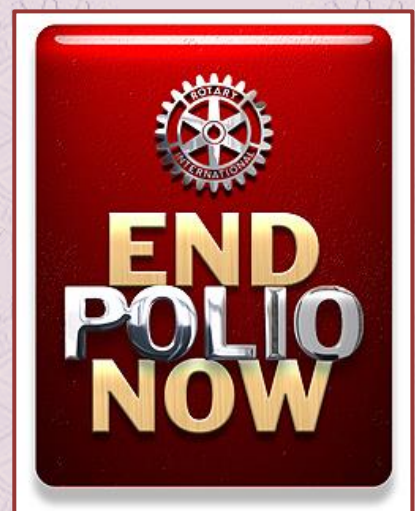

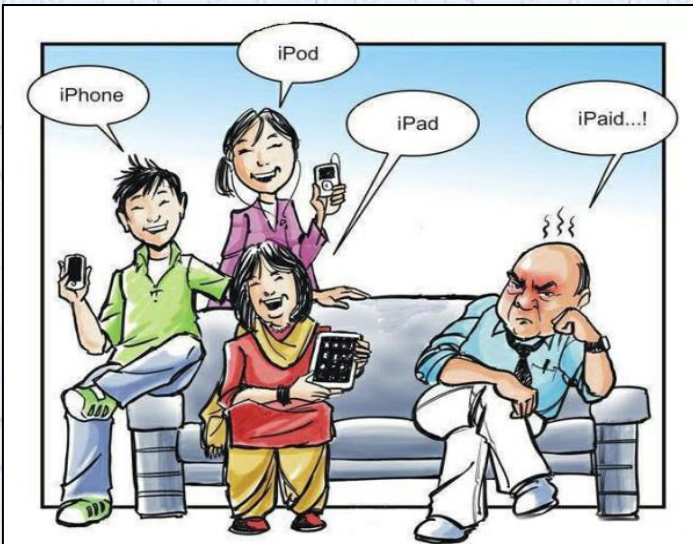

Polio this week 22nd June 2015

- An Independent Outbreak Response Assessment in Equatorial Guinea took place last week with over a year since the most recent case of polio on the 3 May 2014. They concluded that there is no evidence that wild poliovirus continues to circulate in the country and that there has been a significant improvement in surveillance. Strengthening routine immunization was identified as the highest priority for sustaining the gains of the outbreak response.

- Expert groups in polio-infected areas are actively evaluating progress. Last week, the Technical Advisory Group for Afghanistan and Pakistan met to review the latest epidemiology, while this week an international outbreak assessment team is evaluating the situation in the Horn of Africa. Similar expert bodies will convene in other infected areas/countries over the coming months.
