Guest Speaker: Sean Kelly
Deputy Superintendent Casuarina Prison.



Sean has been 21 years in the Prison System, 10 years in the UK. Arrived in Australia, applied for a Prison position, was given a job at Albany Regional Prison, spent 4 years in Albany learned a lot.

Promoted to Hakea Prison to be head of security which was challenging, responsible for all prison security, staff and inmates, had to handle the ever increasing drug problem. Drugs were rife, brought in mainly by visitors. "We would catch someone out nearly every day".

Progressed from Hakea to Banjup Women's Prison again in security, spent 12 years in security. Then to Banksia Hill as Deputy Superintendent.

2 years ago promotion to Casuarina Prison as Deputy Superintendent where he effectively runs the day to day operations of the prison.

Inmates lives are totally regimented on a daily basis. Their freedom has been taken away from them, there are 64 people to each wing, they have a strict routine from their wake-up call in the morning until they are locked away for 12 hours at night.

Casuarina Prison is the main maximum-security prison for male prisoners - particularly long-term prisoners - in Western Australia. Surrounded by a range of state-of-the-art security devices, the prison has a special unit for intensive, high-security supervision of offend

The prison operates the State's biggest infirmary which is about the same size as a small country hospital.

It also has a variety of workshops where prisoners can learn metal fabrication, cabinet making, boot and shoe manufacturing, printing, baking and making concrete products.

Casuarina was originally opened in 1991 with 360 beds, presently has 950.

Casuarina is currently undergoing a massive \$186 million building program due to be completed around the end of 2020.

There will be 4 new units at Casuarina, 2 of those are a different approach to dealing with prisoners. One of these will be Australia's first alcohol and drug facility for male prisoners, the 2nd will be dealing with people with mental issues. Another unit will be specifically for the over 75 year old's

Over 900 people work at Casuarina, 700 staff + about 200 teachers, contractors and social workers, with 120 staff present on any given day.

Sean is married with family, he believes that he has two personalities, one he takes to work and one at home, the two never meet. Sean believes the new facilities being built will help to make the WA prison system a decent and humane organisation.
