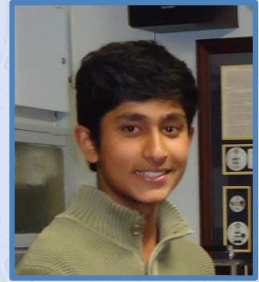
All well until John spotted an ever increasing bulge in the shade canopy, better get rid of that thought John I'll just push it up a little and direct it on to the ground.
