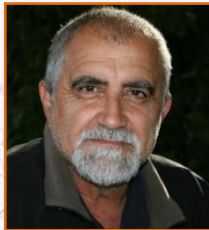

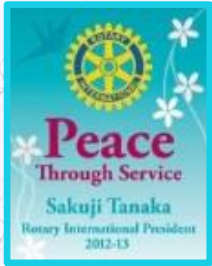

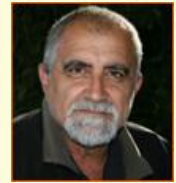

Indigenous Cambodia Experience

Indigenous students, Rhys Collard, Jessica Collard, Lance Dann and Kenisha Franklin–Waigana, are four of eight students who have been selected to attend an immersion experience in Cambodia.

The first parent evening for students and their parents was held at the College and lead by Ms Carol Garlett, Director and Chair of the Department of Education Services Western Australia for the Perth region. Students, parents and visitors shared a meal and learned more about the challenges of the upcoming tour. All students were presented with a folder containing the details of the tour and asked to keep a journal in the lead up to the trip.

This is the first time that an initiative of this kind has been embarked upon and thanks to the support of Mrs. Lisa Dann, our students are able to be part of this experience. These students will need our support as they have to work toward raising all their own funds to cover the cost of the trip. Many fund raising efforts have been held including a Movie Night, Quiz Night, Art Raffle, sold chocolates and noodles to name a few. The trip will be over 10 days.

Timor-Leste Visit 2013 to Orphanage in Laga.

Janet Skeet and Wendy Cooper were fortunate enough to spend 5 days with the Salation Sisters and 112 girls at the Laga Orphanage about 3 hour drive from Dili. The orphanage is Spartan and very regimented. The children have no toys and limited sporting equipment. At 1pm everyone has a 2 hour rest or sleep with bed time scheduled between 9.30 – 10pm

We encouraged the Sister's to make a wish list and as a result we were able to purchase most of the list in Dili before we left. Pens, pencils, reams of paper, blue tac, erasers, scissors, frisbees, balls, skipping ropes and hoopla hoops as well as a much desired microphone and amplifier were delivered.

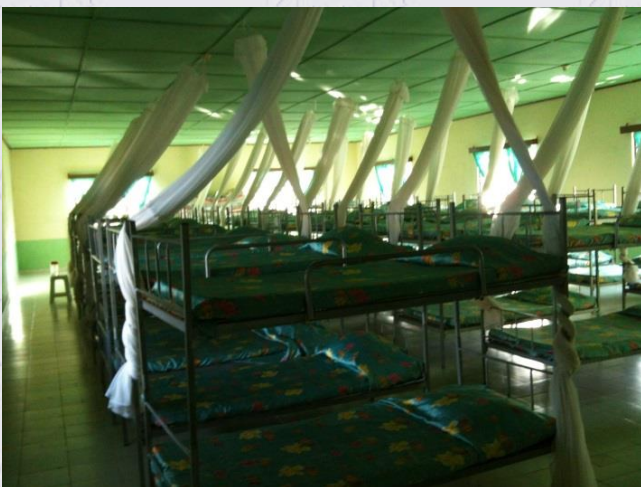
