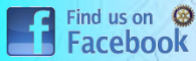

Partners are welcome to attend next Monday's night's meeting to hear the speeches if they so wish.



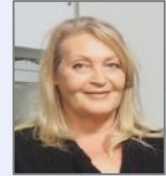

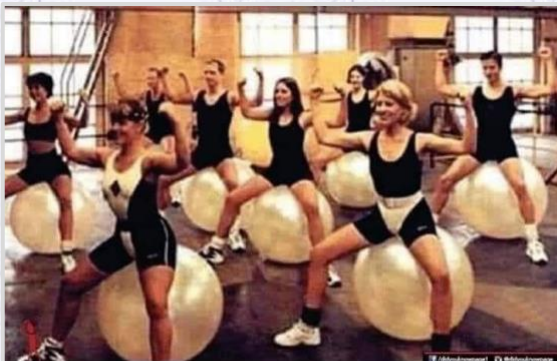

Polio this week

22nd June 2022

The Global Polio Laboratory Network (GPLN) has confirmed the isolation of type 2 vaccine-derived poliovirus (VDPV2) from environmental samples in London, United Kingdom (UK), which were detected as part of ongoing disease surveillance. It is important to note that the virus has been isolated from environmental samples only – no associated cases of paralysis have been detected.

Recent coverage for the primary course of DTaP/IPV/Hib/HepB vaccination, which protects a 25_Polio_Global_update_22Jun2022 against several diseases including polio, in London suggests immunization coverage of 86.6%. [Read more...](#)

The GPEI has released the [2021 Annual expenditure report](#) which contains details of the programme expenditure for both WHO and UNICEF, broken down by category.

EXPENDITURES 2021

In 2021, total expenditures for the GPEI programme were US\$ 730 million (US\$ 652 million in 2020), finishing the year at approximately US\$ 303 million (US\$ 294 million in 2020), or 29.3%, below budget. See link above for a full report

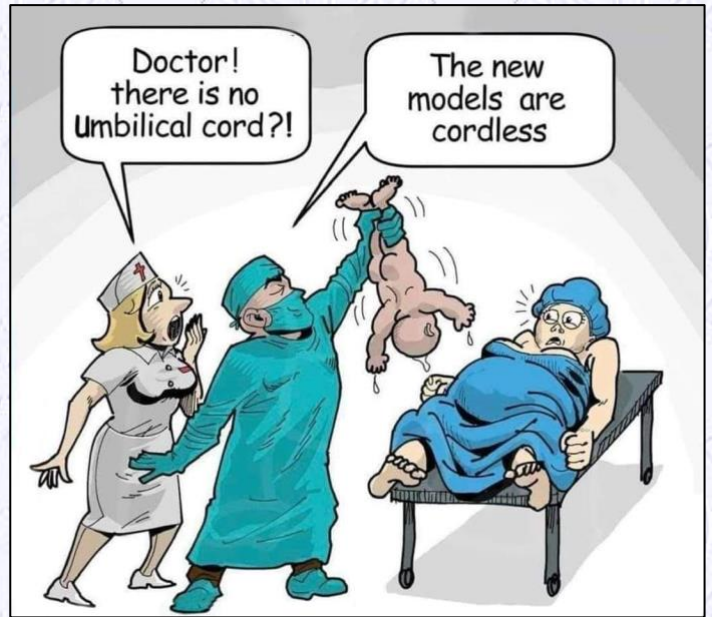
