Dear fellow Rotarians,



## ROTARY CLUB OF MELVILLE MEETING REPORTS

**Meeting Date: Monday 26<sup>th</sup> August, 2019**

**Venue: Sir Francis Burt Law Courts**

A fantastic excursion to the Sir Francis Burt Law Centre gave an opportunity for a large group of Rotarians and friends to experience court involvement from a different perspective.

Our initial attendance at the Sir Francis Burt Law Centre resulted in a mock trial (but it seemed so real!) whereby we all were actual participants aiming to provide evidence and applying justice as best as could possibly be done.

The trial was presided over by Judge (President) David Hewitt and Judge (Sergeant) Murray Meaton who were the relevant presiding judges. They controlled proceedings (as best they could) while the accused in this matter (Rtn Marilyn Kench) a young 20 year old sat forlornly in the dock awaiting her fate over a charge of murder.

An eager and relentless prosecutor (Doug, 'hangem' Minchin ) did his best to convince the erstwhile jury that this accused woman was no shrinking violet who had been vexed by the man who she believed loved her. He adduced her actions of shooting the man she loved (not the messenger) was intentional.

Intriguing to see PP Rob Willis cross dressing and giving evidence as to his dancing in the Government house ballroom followed by PP Leigh Smith as a medico who treated the injured man until his passing. Fortuitously Constable Ross Ballard was there to capture the accused and ensure she would answer the serious charges.

Fortunately for the accused a passionate defence by barristers (Rtn) Pounder and (Rtn) Ware saved her skin and the jury spared her of the conviction of 'murder'. All over we thought only to find the jury convicted the scorned woman on a charge of 'manslaughter' for which the presiding judges imposed an eight year sentence.

All participants then attended a real trial matter in the Perth District Court watching true justice in action. A terrific afternoon was had and not only enlightened us as to the early days of Justice in Western Australia but further to see that work in action in today's time.

**Meeting Date: Monday 2<sup>nd</sup> September, 2019**

At 1.30pm, Sergeant opened the meeting, which had over forty people present for the “Each One Bring One” Jon Sanders talk on his upcoming eleventh circumnavigation of the world. Jon was introduced immediately and the talk was in the format of an interview style, with Ralph Newton

and Dr Steven Davies, an advisor to the government, interviewing Jon, who is an OA and MBE. Jon is a true blue Aussie, with his family going way back, and his father a professor at UWA.

Jon sails the world because it gives him seething to do, but what he always cherishes most is coming home. Many of Jon's trips are windward, which means that they are hard work because his is sailing against the wind rather than running with it.

Jon had some interesting experiences in some ports. On one trip his passport photo was upside down, and most countries weren't concerned about, but the most problems occurred coming back into Australia, which made him smile. On another trip, when he arrived at the port, he asked where he should put all his rubbish that he had collected and had in large rubbish bags. The Port Authority person then took his rubbish bags and tipped them into the harbour! Jon was annoyed, and said, well, I could have done that!

Preparation for his upcoming trip is on schedule, and currently the engine is being checked and rechecked to make sure it is in tip top condition. Jon usually buys packaged and canned food and lots of powdered milk for his voyage, and when he can he buys fresh fruit and vegetables. He believes himself to be fit and healthy at the moment, and therefore ready for this voyage. In his first few weeks at sea, he usually gets fitter and leaner. Jon is carrying more electronic equipment on this voyage, than he has before. Jon uses an AIS system for navigation and this allows him to sleep as it sends and alarm if other boats or ships are nearby.

Jon's boat is called Parry Endeavour after Kevin Parry who had funded several of his previous voyages. His previous boat Perie Banou was named by his wife after the film Arabian Nights. His boats are SS34's and SS39's designed in the 1970's. They are slower boats, but very seaworthy, and can ride the waves like a cork, rather than going up on them and smashing down. In order to stay safe, Jon always wears a harness when the weather is bad, and even wears one in good weather when he goes forward on the boat.

Jon has mentored David Dicks when he set out to circumnavigate the world when he was only 16 years of age. He has also delivered many boats to Australia for their owners who have not wanted to sail them themselves from other countries.

Jon is going to be away eight months and at the age of 80 years will be the oldest sailor to circumnavigate the world. He will be taking water samples as he goes, and then dropping them off in various ports for them to be sent to Curtin University to be analysed to identify the level of microplastics in them. His voyage will set a baseline of the amount of micro plastics in the ocean for the first time in history. This fits in nicely with the Rotary Club of Melville's proposal to work with Greenbatch to forward the recycling of bottles and production of objects from the plastic.

After the talk, there were two market reports: one from Graham Wheeler for the 25<sup>th</sup> August, Graham reported a pleasant market with 134 bays, and he was assisted by Ross Calnan and David Fienberg, with a Leeuwin candidate manning the Lower Spinner. David Porter reported the market on 1<sup>st</sup> September was small with only 32 bays. He was assisted by Massimo Cau and Laura Porrato, and the rain arrived at 9.00am. The Lower spinner was manned by Inner wheel.

There was then time for a few quiz questions from the Sergeant, some Happy Dollars and a Heads and Tails, and a lovely bottle of Barossa Valley Shiraz was won by Marilyn Barton. President David thanked everyone for attending and reminded all members that next Monday is the Club Forum and a Cluster meeting will be held on the 25<sup>th</sup> September. The meeting concluded with the Rotary Charge.
