1-Shirts for the Homeless

Supporting homeless people in Columbus by using our creative design skills to develop messages of hope, generated through conversations with staff at a homeless shelter, and print them on shirts and sweatshirts for distribution at the shelter.

2-Artists In Action

Knowing that young artists often feel isolated, that their talents aren't validated as practical, and that other activities often get more attention, the team promoted awareness of young artists by designing and distributing t-shirts to young artists that say "Till death, we do art."

Berwick Rocks!

Involving the PreK-8 student body, student council and families in fostering positive, caring behaviors with each other through creating a peace rock garden that helps us focus on the idea of having a unified school where everyone feels safer together.

Feeding the Homeless

Teaching and encouraging empathy, respect and compassion within the student body for the less fortunate in our community with an emphasis on providing much needed materials for the homeless at Faith Mission.

Tigers' ROAR into Peace!

Increasing peace in the school and community by personal growth in <u>Respect-Ownership-Accountability-Resilience</u>, modeling these behaviors, and setting a standard that a positive character represents a popular personality at Champion and a "peace maker" everywhere.

Promoting and exemplifying the value of selfless concern for others through organized efforts – Random Acts of Kindness Day, valentines to hospitalized children, assisting neighbors with chores – and through everyday use of kind words and positive behavior.

Columbus City Preparatory School for Girls

Remaining Resilient

Demonstrating the value and power of resiliency in students' lives by focusing on resilient characters in assigned novels, visiting Ronald McDonald house to observe resilience, meeting Canine Companion dogs who assist with resilience, and by performing The Voice and Fear Face to raise funds for these groups.

Columbus Gifted Academy

Operation Safe Space

Creating safe spaces at school for LGBT+ students by educating teachers and students, being available for helping students having a hard time with their sexuality or gender, promoting a CGA Day for Gender Justice, and other methods created to increase sensitivity and respect.

Columbus Global Academy

CGA English Club

Assisting and reinforcing fellow students who speak minimal English by helping them to: have basic conversations in English; recognize the English alphabet and numbers; and, express their personality in English – all by working on our own English proficiency and teaching skills.

Columbus Scioto 6-12

Pop Can Tabs for Ronald McDonald House

Supporting kids and families served by Ronald McDonald House by touring RMH to learn about its services, directly see RMH "in action," and then deciding to collect as many pop tabs as possible to help RMH with funding for its expenses.

Dominion Middle School

Depression Awareness Campaign

Raising awareness about depression in self and others through teachers presenting Nationwide Children's Hospital's Signs of Suicide program, and following up by distributing informational packets and sharing table top statistics during lunch periods.

Hilltonia Middle School

It Can Happen to Anyone

Educating students about the opioid epidemic and its impact on the neighborhood, and helping students impacted by opioids feel less alone through presentations by Ohio Health and Columbus Public Health, an interactive art display, and sharing a student-created song and video with the entire school.

Indianola Informal K-8

1-Support the Humane Society not Puppy Mills

Showing the differences in dog treatment between the Humane Society and puppy mills and encouraging puppy shopping at the Society by various ways of sharing information and then supporting the Society financially using bake sales at after school activities.

2-Stop Bullying

Conducting an anti-bullying campaign using posters, informational announcements, classroom discussions, and nutritional snacks.
