I have made contact with the travel agent in Varsity Lakes that is organising travel arrangements for **the Honolulu Convention in June next year.**

The following is a start for you to consider if you would like to attend.

Flights on Hawaiian Airlines from Brisbane and 8 nights accommodation. Gives you time before and after the conference in Honolulu.

Thursday June 4

Brisbane to Honolulu Hawaiian Airlines depart 9.45 pm, arrive 11.00 am same day (international date line)

Friday June 12

Honolulu to Brisbane Hawaiian Airlines depart 1.35 pm, arrive 7.45 pm Sat 13 June

Accommodation arrival June 4, departure June 12:

1. Holiday Inn Express (3 star)
2. Double Tree by Hilton Alana (4 star)
3. Moana Surfrider (5 star)

Total including economy class air plus accommodation room only (except Holiday Inn includes breakfast)

1. A\$2695 per person, twin share
2. A\$2720 per person, twin share
3. A\$2944 per person, twin share

I will have single occupancy rates soon.

All hotels in Hawaii charge a compulsory daily "Resort Fee" (read: rip off)

1. US\$28.74 but includes breakfast
2. US\$30 includes nothing except WiFi
3. US\$40 includes nothing except WiFi

Registration Fee for the conference is US\$450 per person. Basically only includes admission to the conference. No meals. Nothing.

At today's rate is Australian \$656.00. The Australian dollar has dropped to its lowest level in 10 years against the US dollar
