Following the opening and Toasts to Rotary, President Kirk called for announcements. Services Director Alan Guignon thanked everyone who worked at the **Golden Wheel Villas dinner**. The foods were delicious, Rotarians mixing with the residents was appreciated and to cap a successful night there was a record attendance of residents. The Board has allocated \$3,000 to Surfers Paradise State School as follows – to help provide Uniforms and shoes for the needy and to allocate funds to those who need support for school camps. **Donna** thanked those who brought postage stamps – they are a rare commodity and she appeals to everyone to **save and donate used Postage Stamps**.

Alan Guignon then introduced **Guest Speaker Dr Perry Cross**. Perry was born in Taree, grew up on the Gold Coast and went to TSS, where sport was his passion. Two years out of school his neck was broken in a Rugby Trial at Ballymore and he joined 20,000 other Australians with spinal injuries. He set up the Perry Cross Foundation which raises funds locally to fund a laboratory at Gold Coast University Hospital focusing on finding a cure for spinal injuries. This focuses on cell transplant therapy, has raised \$7.6m and plans to initiate the first blind random trial spinal cell transplant on patients in mid 2024. The December 2023 Perry Cross was awarded an Honorary Doctorate by Griffith University for all his outstanding work. He has also set up Accessible Homes Australia 3 years ago to deliver suitable homes for people with Spinal injuries. The first homes are in an 8-storey building at Palm Beach with individual carefully designed apartments and a central supervisor always on-call and social mixing facilities and has the advantage of a central location in the community. This project was the **Queensland winner of the** Telstra Best of Business Award 2024. Stuart Fairley thanked Perry Cross for this wonderful insight into the work of the Foundation.
