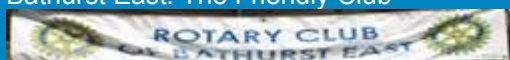

Guest Speaker

Our guest speaker this week was Neil Moon principal of the Carenne School, Bathurst. Neil was introduced to the meeting by PP Terry Mahony.

Neil gave interesting and varied facts and information about the School saying he has been at Carenne in Bathurst for six years now. The school has 104 students in 14 classes with students ranging from "beginners" to 9 students in Year 12.



When Carenne was first established it was known as Glenray School and housed in a disused stable at the rear of the Uniting Church in Bathurst. It opened on 17 July 1957 with one teacher and eight students. The school was independently owned by the Sub-Normal Children's Welfare Association.

In November, 1961 the school moved to its current location in Browning Street, Bathurst where it was housed in a building built from both volunteered labour and fundraised money. A donation was made to the school by the NSW government, allowing it to open at its new premises completely debt free. The education department became involved at this time, providing a teacher and equipment for one group of students and subsidising the other.

In February, 1971 the school was purchased by the state education department, and in 1980, the school was greatly expanded with the construction of new classrooms and the name was changed from Glenray to Carenne.

One of the school's major projects is the construction of a hydrotherapy spa, and with the help of the State Government along with the generosity of the Bathurst public, the spa can now be built.

Neil ended his talk giving details of the many projects the school has undertaken including students having hands on experience for example, with the Bathurst Fire Station.

Neil was thanked for his attendance and the interesting facts by PP Geoff Fry, with Geoff also presenting Neil with another of our highly educated, spa washed, coffee mugs.

What can you do as a Rotarian that shows your local community how you demonstrate a practical support for international understanding in these difficult times when we face so many potential tensions between various cultures and countries?



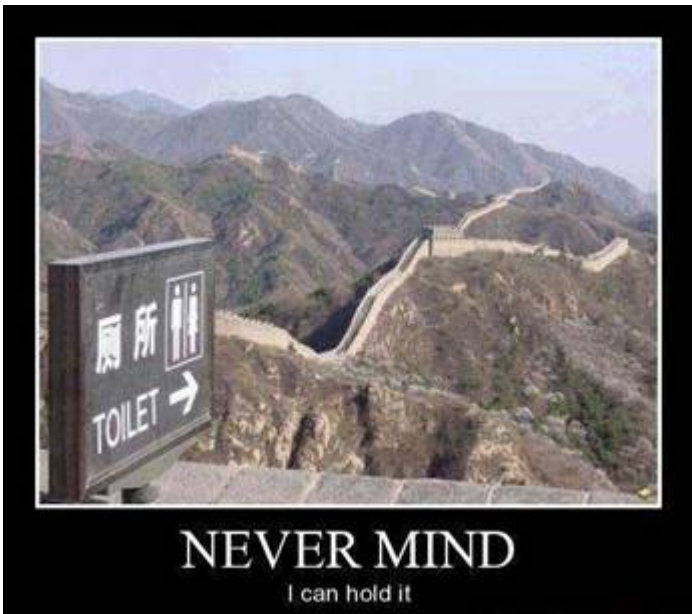

When she went to investigate, she saw the other roosters were busy chasing pullets, bells-a-ringing, but the pullets, hearing the roosters coming, would run for cover.

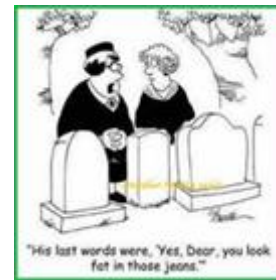
To Brenda's amazement, old Butch had his bell in his beak, so it couldn't ring. He'd sneak up on a pullet, do his job and walk on to the next one.

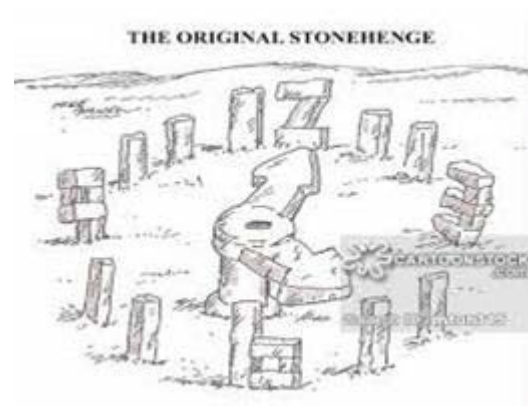
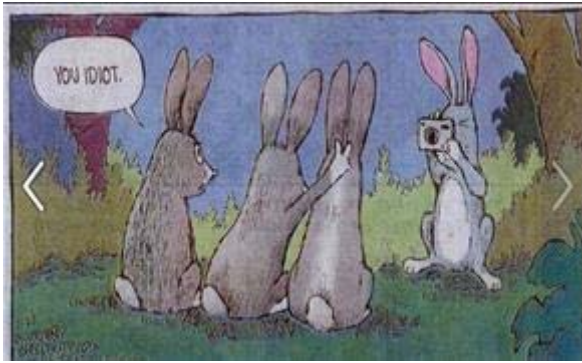
Brenda was so proud of old Butch, she entered him in the Brisbane City Show and he became an overnight sensation among the judges.

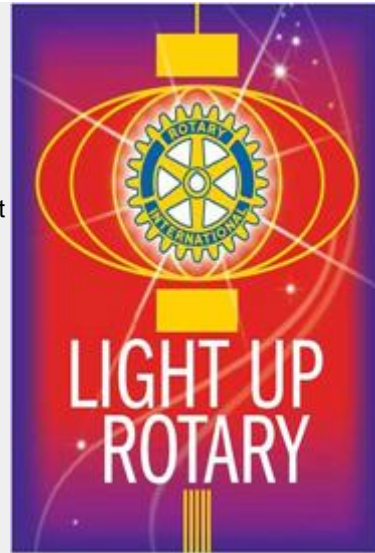
What is Rotary?
